### Home Gardener's Handbook Save Plants by Early Storm Repairs

Storm damage looks bad enough to the casual observer. But insects and diseases and damaged plants easy victims and can take an even greater toll than the storm itself.

By making early repairs on broken limbs, uprooted trees and mangled shrubs, you give attention to a desirable, but often neglected, aspect of your yard.

Nature will often repair minor storm damage, but your help hastens the healing process. Wounds that are not smoothed to heal properly can become a source of infection.

Remove large limbs carefully. Make three cuts to avoid tearing the bark when the branch falls. Saw into the limb from the top, then cut from the bottom.

When damage lowers the value of your property, you may be able to deduct this loss from your federal income tax.

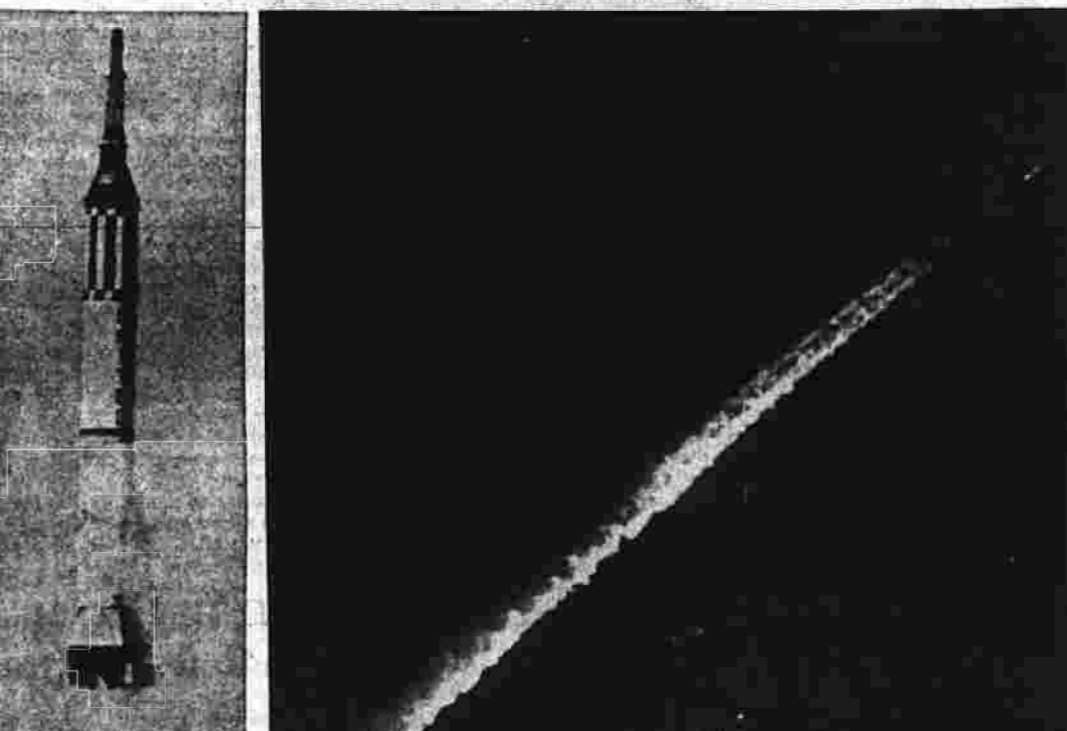

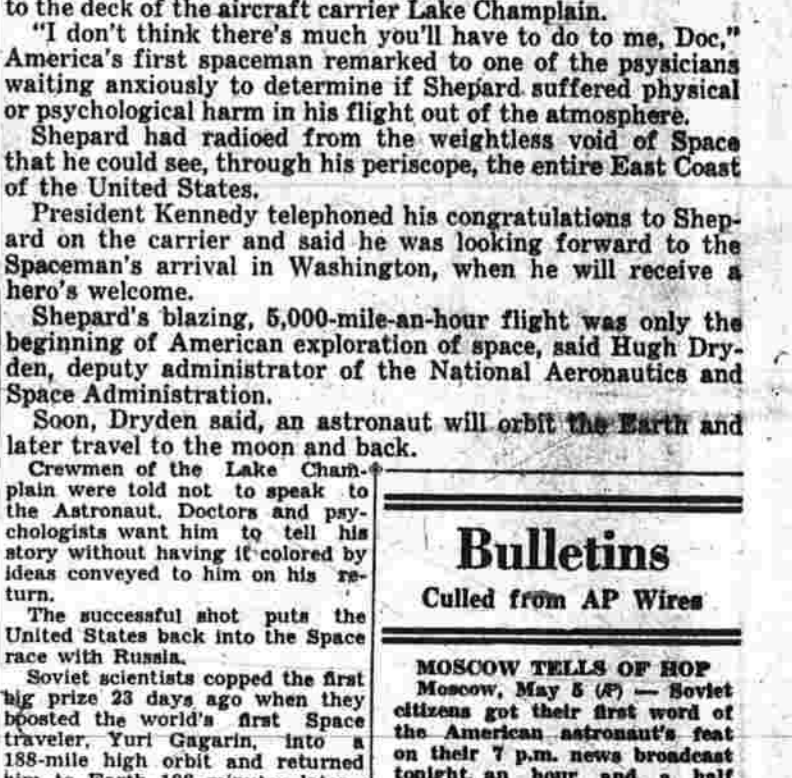
