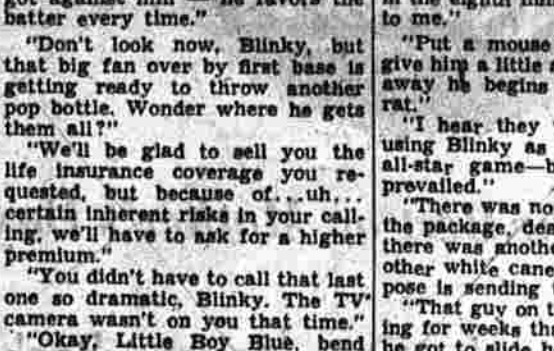

### Home Gardener's Handbook How to Win Gardener's Blue Ribbon

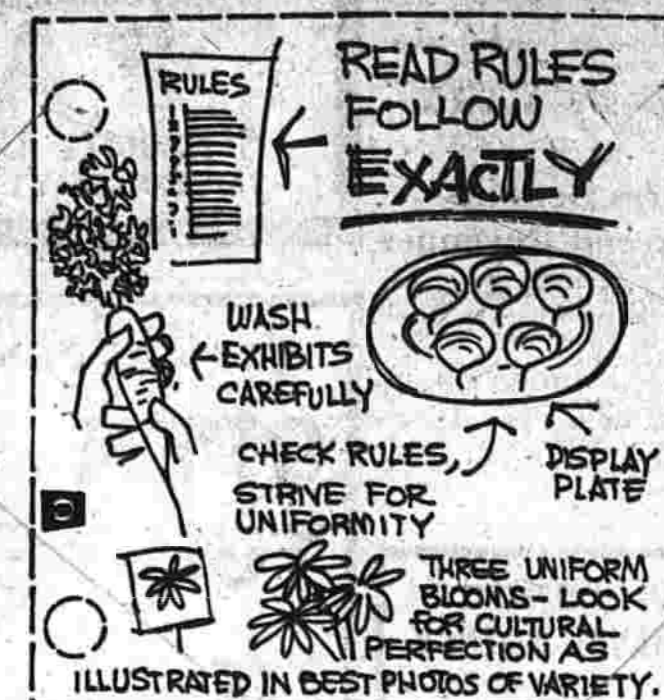

If you have a specialty or just enjoy growing better than the rest, you can be a prize gardener this year. Dozens of flower and garden exhibitions from local shows to state fairs, offer you many opportunities to win blue ribbons as well as cash awards.

Start by learning your blue ribbon is to decide to enter. Write your local papers for announcements. Check with your local garden center for information on nearby exhibitions. Request schedules and entry blanks.

Welcome competition. Many new exhibitors try hard to beat veteran garden showmen. Read the exhibitor's rules carefully. Worthy entries have been disqualified because the entrant misunderstood directions. Exhibit only the number of specimens called for in the rules—no more, no less. If carrots should have tops or beets have none, make sure your entry is correct.

Rules at various shows may differ. Know the regulations and make sure your entry will conform.



During the time before the show, give your plants the same attention you have in the past. Add a little extra care. Keep insects and diseases under control. Use fertilizers to keep the size and quality that will win.

Knowing what judges want will help in selecting specimens. Basically, judges look for cultural perfection and uniformity. Both factors count heavily.

Cultural perfection means specimens that look like the picture on the seed package. Uniformity means having all blooms, vegetables or fruit in one specimen, each other and the standard of perfection as closely as possible.

Conditioning helps your entry toward the coveted first prize. For flowers, cut blooms the night before they are to be judged. Put them in warm water in a clean container in a cool spot all night. Make a fresh cut before the show to boost water uptake.

Ever-increasing costs have forced the raising of tuition fees for the first time at the Hartford Graduate Center of Renaissance Polytechnic Institute, Dean Warren C. Stoker said today.

Tuition fees, effective with the fall semester, will be \$15 over the present rates.

"We have never changed our original tuition which was set on a trial basis in 1953 when the Hartford Graduate Center was started," Dean Stoker said. "Since then, courses have been expanded greatly as we have attempted to keep pace with the ever-growing educational needs of scientists and engineers in this area."

He said that since the Center was started there has been an increase of 50 per cent in the number of faculty. At the same time, course offerings have increased from 16 in 1953 to 48 in the current semester.

"When we started," he said, "we covered four major subject areas. This has since been expanded to 11. At the present, a doctoral program is also under development."

### The Doctor Says

Disinfectant? Antibiotic? Here's How They Differ

By HAROLD THOMAS HYMAN, M.D.

A high school senior, preparing a term paper, finds herself puzzled by the words antiseptic, disinfectant, germicide and antibiotic. "Do these all mean the same thing?" she asks. "And if they are different, how do they differ?"

Let's take the first two, to begin with. And we'll add bactericide for good measure.

Each of these words refers to a chemical substance that kills germs or bacteria (germicide, bactericide). When the germicide or bactericide is used to prevent bacteria from entering body tissue, it is an antiseptic. And when it is used to kill bacteria that have already entered the tissue, it is a disinfectant.

For example, when your doctor paints your skin with iodine before he gives an injection or makes an incision, he is using an antiseptic. And when he uses the tincture to an infected wound he is using it as a disinfectant.

### Emphasis On Health

Hopes for the yearling children, a different viewpoint on the best treatment for tuberculosis and a new tool for the blind figure in medical news, along with a psychoanalyst of Adolf Hitler.

**Hope**  
Can a childless couple still have hope after the woman passes her 60th birthday?  
Medical statistics covering 39 million live births in the 1945-1958 decade show the birth of a first child to a woman over 50 occurs slightly more often than the birth of quadruplets to women of all childbearing ages. The figures also show:  
Women 40-44 in New York City are three times as likely to have birth to a live child as they are to suffer death in an accident. The five birth to a woman 45-49 years old is more frequent than the birth to triplets.  
The increase of twins and triplets to mothers over 40 appears to be the same as the average for the entire childbearing age.

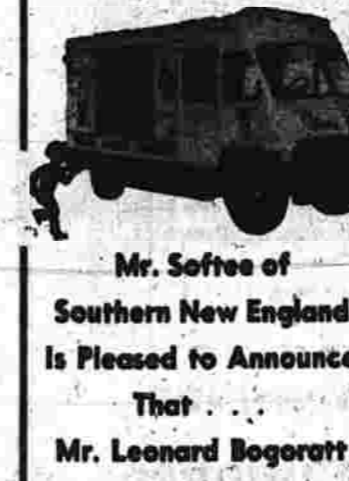
**Electronic Case**  
Two researchers have developed an electronic case for the blind. The device, which is being field tested, can be carried like a small brief case. It shoots out pulses of infrared light. When the beam strikes an object up to 10 feet away, it is sent back to a photoelectric cell in the case and triggers a buzzer.  
The user then can press a button which cuts the range of the beam to five feet. This is a rough estimate of the distance of the object.  
The instrument was designed by J. Malvern Benjamin Jr., an engineer for Biophysical Electronics Inc., New Hope, Pa., and T. A. Benjamin, a physicist at Haverford College.

**Bed Rest for TB?**  
Some doctors in London question the advisability of strict bed rest for pulmonary tuberculosis patients receiving antituberculous drugs.  
A report on 42 London TB patients treated with such drugs was carried in "What's New," a publication of About Labor, a London newspaper.  
Some of the patients were put in bed to stay. The others remained in bed only if they felt ill. They were allowed to do what they wished, short of becoming breathless or fatigued.  
The groups were assessed after six months and one year. No difference was found in the rate of recovery. Patients in the rest group were off work twice as long as those in the unrestricted group.  
The doctors who conducted the tests said long periods of bed rest should not be prescribed until proof of its value in treatment is shown.

**Hitler Analyzed**  
A New York psychiatrist who made a detailed study of the behavior of Adolf Hitler has coined a new name for his mental classification — "psychic character."  
Dr. Norbert Bromberg of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine said:  
"Hitler manifested such accurate perception and shrewd manipulation of political and group psychological realities that he achieved great success, earning him the designation, 'political genius.'"  
"On the other hand, he revealed psychotic features such as irrational hate and paranoid ideas. It would therefore seem that he belonged to a group of borderline cases that includes individuals who are neither totally and irreversibly psychotic, nor always and in a psychic functioning relatively normal."  
He said cases of this kind can be classified as psychotic character.

Chicago — The American Music Conference estimates that more than 8,000,000 children are playing musical instruments and receiving instruction in them in schools and from private teachers. Nearly half this number are taking piano lessons.

### Rockville-Vernon Bolton Appeal Denied; Repair Contracts Let

The Vernon Board of Education today turned down a group of requests by the Bolton Board of Education that Vernon take in junior high school students on a tuition basis beginning in 1962.

Vernon school board members said Vernon will have enough room trying to find room for its own students.

The Bolton request, prompted by existing and anticipated crowding in the Bolton school, was made to the Vernon School Superintendent Raymond E. Ramadani last week. Vernon school board members could take anywhere from 10 to 252 grade 7, 8 and 9 students in 1962, 1963 and in succeeding years.

"The situation is impossible," said Vernon Chairman Walter A. Kiefer after the short discussion of the request.

The decision came in a lengthy business meeting in which the board approved the 1961-62 school renovation program, fuel and summer maintenance work, and handled a number of other agenda items.

Representatives to the Talbotville School and to the basement of Building B which will be used temporarily next fall, will be done by George Fachibobila, the low bidder on the combined job.

His price for Talbotville School is \$4,475, and for Building B, \$3,682. Herbert I. Pagani was next in line with bids of \$4,875 and \$4,000, respectively. Edridge Yost submitted a \$4,525 bid on the Talbotville school.

Three oil companies were awarded bids on fuel. Farmel Inc., Blocton Fuel Co. and Davis and DeSeth Co.

### Hadassah Raises \$16 Million For Hospital in Middle East

Are you covered by the nation's workers' compensation laws? Should you be covered? How does this insurance coverage work? What is the significance to workers?

This is what I asked J. M. Switzer, president of Employers Mutual of Wausau, Wis., whose company was the first ever to write a compensation policy in this country—back in 1911. He has all the answers.

About 80 per cent of all workers in every state are covered and should you be unless you are self-employed or work in an industry that has its own coverage such as the railroad and maritime workers.

Check your coverage by asking your company's personnel officer. You should report to him any on-the-job injuries. The amount of compensation you will receive depends upon the type of injury sustained and the rate set for that injury.

If you are a new employer, perhaps a small business man, and have overlooked getting such coverage for your workers, don't delay any longer for you could be sued in the event of an accident. You could be held to the extent of your business and your personal assets.

Your state industrial commission can tell you how to arrange coverage which is written by private insurance companies. The rate charged by any company will be continuous use longer than any other United States church. Work accidents cost the nation more than \$4 billion a year, plus an approximately \$1.8 billion for temporary disability."

The law helps prevent accidents because a high accident rate forces the employer's insurance costs up. Therefore it becomes good business to promote safety and eliminate possibly unsafe work situations.

### Vernon Officials Propose Ecker Farm Purchase at \$55,000

Vernon selectmen last night approved a special town meeting to purchase the Ecker farm in Vernon Center for future town use at a price of \$55,000.

First Selectman George E. Riley and Town Counsel Robert J. Kahan outlined the proposal to members of the Board of Education in conjunction with a discussion of cemetery needs over the next 10 years.

An appropriation for the \$55,000 was approved last night by the Board of Finance and will be put before voters for final approval in a special town meeting May 23.

The selectmen also proposed selling on a sealed bid basis the present town home, Vernon Haven, to help pay for the purchase of the farm property.

Riley said the Ecker farm would afford the town a future school site, a site for a town works area, land for anticipated cemetery needs, and park and recreation area.

He estimated the farm has about 3,000 feet of frontage along West Rd., Dart Rd., and Hartford Tpke., which border the property on the west and south.

Over Frederick Ecker would be given life tenancy in the house in the event the town buys the property.

The move to purchase the farm was prompted only days ago, Riley said, when the selectmen learned it was available. The town late last week took out an option on the property.

As a future school site, the farm fits in with a recommendation in the master plan of the Vernon Fire District to set aside property in Vernon Center for a new elementary school.

School Superintendent Raymond E. Ramwell predicted the need for four new schools plus additions to existing schools by the 1970-71 school year.

Sale of the Vernon Haven county home across West Rd. from the Ecker property would go a long way toward making up the purchase cost, according to Selectman William R. Hahn.

### Student Released In CD Protest

Hartford, May 10 (AP)—A 22-year-old college student who became involved in a Civil Defense protest on the spur of the moment has been cleared of the charge against him.

The student, David Tilden of Weymouth, was arrested with a group of Civil Defense protesters in front of the old state House April 26 during a test alert. They were arrested after refusing to take over, police said.

In circuit court yesterday, Judge Douglas B. Wright discharged Tilden on the grounds the student had shown he was not part of the group and was now repentant.

Three other persons arrested during the same demonstration, James D'Annunzio, 40, of Pritchville, Mrs. Beverly Kagan, 20, of Norwich, and Kenneth Mosier, 26, of Norwich, were bound over to superior court on charges of obstructing a Civil Defense exercise.

The case against Mrs. Marjorie Swann, 40, of Norwich, was continued until Thursday when a preliminary hearing was held. She did not appear because of illness.

Tilden said he had stopped among the demonstrators because he is "interested in the state of the world."

Police said he picked up a sign and refused to take cover because the shelter was inadequate.

Later, he said he was sorry for his actions and that if he knew he would be arrested he would have taken cover, police added.

Among the organizers of the protest was the Committee for Non-Violent Action.

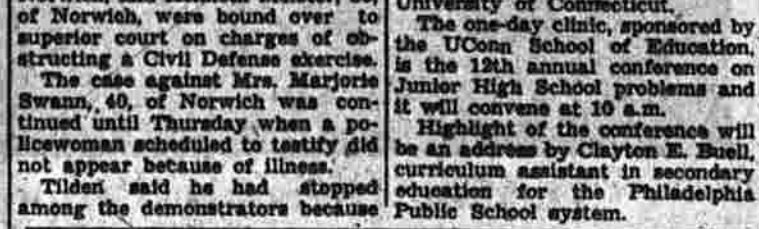
