Welcome competition. Many new exhibitors who try hard have beaten veteran garden showmen. Read the exhibitors' rules carefully. Worthy entries have been disqualified because the entrant misunderstood directions. Exhibit only the number of specimens called for in the rules—no more, no less. If carrots should have tops or beets have none, make sure your entry is correct.

Rules at various shows may differ. Know the regulations and make sure your entry will conform.

During the time before the show, give your plants or crops the same attention you have in the past. Add a little extra tender care. Keep insects and diseases under control. Use fertilizer to produce the size and quality that will win.

Knowing what judges want will help in selecting specimens. Basically, judges look for cultural perfection and uniformity. Both factors count heavily.

Therein lies the weakness of chemical antisepsis and disinfections, it's a different story.

Cultural perfection means specimens that look like the picture on the seed package. Uniformity means having all blooms, vegetables or fruit in one class match each other and the standard of perfection as closely as possible.

Conditioning helps your entry to ward the coveted first prize. For flowers, cut blooms the night before they are to be judged. Put them in warm water, but keep the container in a cool spot all night. Make a fresh stem cut before the show to boost water intake.

Make sure your specimens have no spray residue or other foreign material on them. Wash vegetables well. Clean specimens make a more attractive display, Avoid using any that show insect or disease injury.

Disinfectant? Antibotic? Here's How They Differ Y HAROLD THOMAS HYMAN

Electronic Cane

Two researchers have developed an electronic cane for the blind.
