Leopoldville, The Congo, Stanleyville to come to terms with May 13 (R)—President Joseph Kasavubu today called parliament back into session to help resolve the political chaos that has split the nation since its founding. It is expected to meet in a few weeks.

"After nearly 10 months of confusion, misery and all kinds of privation," the president said in an address, "each of us will have taken note of the need for stable social order based on the principles of public morality and legality."
