A brief report developed two weeks ago around two news items and commentary herein concerning purchase of a street sweeper by the town.

For the benefit of any who may have inferred otherwise, a disclaimer was incorporated within the article. It was stated that the bid opened and accepted by the selectmen was incorporated within the bid opened and accepted by the selectmen.

Any fault for not having made that information clear lies with the person. However, a return to the dim past of May 2 carries the journeyman to a choice of different views of the same subject, which was not given the acceptance of high over low bids, as it was the town meeting in the big time.

For a moment, let us consider the small New England town (pop. 2,000) of Y. In this way, we can all pretend we're reading a Doctor's story, although without the town-searching disclosures over town of lukewarm lentil soup.

Until the 1950s, the annual town meeting in Y was nearly an all-day affair beginning around 8 a.m. and closing down just before supper.

Town officers were, and still are, elected by ballot in the town hall while the meeting was in progress. Those were wild and woolly gatherings. Probably 90 per cent of the town's 1,000 voters attended coming and going during the day.

Every budget item was taken apart, penny by penny, and any suspicion of frivolity on the part of town officers was investigated with the determination of a shark at a swimming meet.

Once, one of the selectmen left his teeth at home, and townspeople, who said afterward, his impaired diction allowed him to allude to a couple of appropriations on them, did not return him to office.

But, the good old days have gone and the town meeting is a shadow of its former self. The budget today is discussed in demurety fashion. The few selected spectators who dutifully as the voters troop to booths in the front of the hall, raising almost automatically when a vote is called from the floor.

The change has been wrought in the last 20 years. The influx of "newcomers" may have a little to do with it. Other factors are, perhaps, the burgeoning of state aid programs, today's preoccupation with television, power lawn mowers and a rec room in the basement, and the apparent lack of glamor and significance of local government in relation to dogma in Laos and Cuba.

While we take off our hat to the town meeting, it has been a school for so many years, we feel it has not only the end of a weary road in Vernon and other booming towns where, very simply, the population explosion has overwhelmed it.

At the current consolidation study was beginning, most of the town's leaders proposed differing paths to the town's goal. The goal was, essentially, a broader government unifying the town, but giving equal voice to recognized segments of it.

With massive population growth, the individual can no longer feel an integral or useful part of the town as a whole. He shifts his allegiance then, to his neighborhood and its affairs. The town becomes more remote.

The point we reach is that this neighborhood, this sectional self-interest, is more compatible with a government which has similar roots.

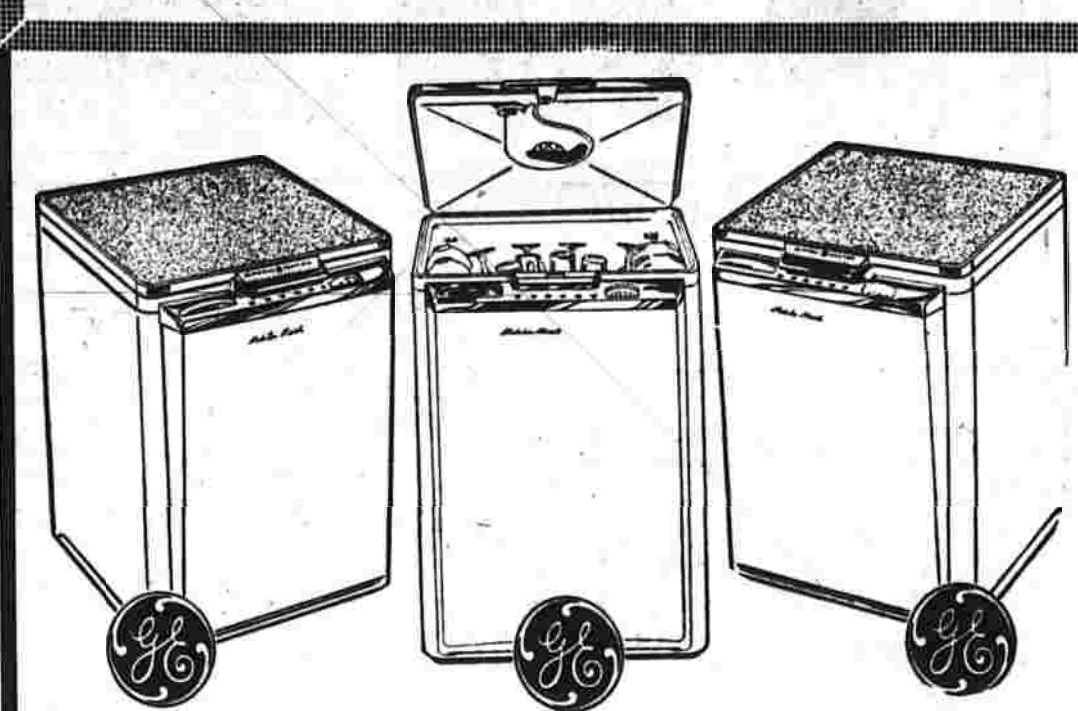
