You would ruff the first diamond, draw trumps in three rounds and play three rounds of the favorable black suit, thus winning five trump tricks and four top tricks in the side suits, plus your one established card in the favorable black suit.

But nothing breaks favorably. Mind you, there are no freakish

about the way you'd expect it too:
Not quite evenly.
How do you make four hearts against those breaks? Show the North and South hands to your friends and see if they can come up with the answer.

The hand was made by Gesa Ottlik, a Hungarian expert, several years ago. His method is simplicity itself, except that it's hard to thing of it.

Ottlik ruffed the first diamond and entered dummy four times with the top cards in spades and clubs to ruff four more diamonds. That gave him the first nine tricks.

"At five o'clock Croation independence was declared under mar-tial law," he continued. "On April 11, the Gestapo came to the Jewish community, seized all the money and placed everyone under arrest."
