PRODUCES ODD PLAY

By Alfred Sheinwold

When the only missing high card of a suit is the queen, you normally do your best to capture it by way of a finesse. It's a bit odd fo insist on giving up a trick to the queen instead of capturing it. West opened the queen of apades, and South won with the king. South led the jack of clubs, and West very sensibly played low.

Strangely enough, South should let the jack of clubs ride for a finesse in this position. If it losses to the queen, South can win a club in his own hand and clear the suit with dummy's top cards to make sure of five club tricks.

If South finesses the jack of clubs and wins the finesse, as he would in this hand, he can continute the finesse. Dummy will capture the queen, but South will win another club trick to make sure of unblocking the suit. This way declarer wins all six club tricks.

Discovers Break

As it happened, South put up dummy's king of clubs, and East's discard revealed the bad break. Now South was in danger of being limited to four club tricks if he played carelessly.



"I went to California hoping to be discovered," he explains. "I was, too — but not for the theatre. I became a lifeguard at Santa Menica Beach, as far away from the theatre and films as anyone could possibly get."

In 1941 Pickard decided to try New York, still hoping for a break in the theatre. "I was discovered in New York too," he continues, "by an artist who used my face for war posters used by young men to join the urging young men to join

service."
Pickard finally decided to take the poster's advice—he joined the Navy in 1942, serving until 1946.
Upon his discharge, he headed back to New York, again hoping to crack the legitimate stage.
