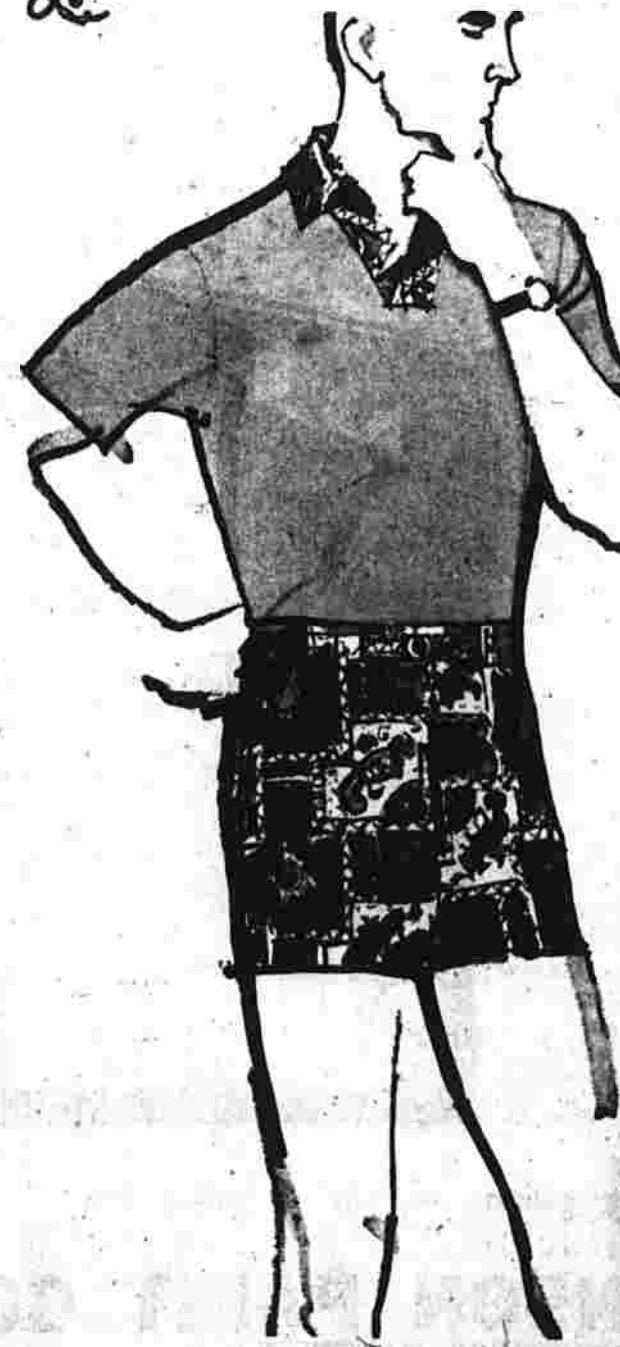

The rebel attack on Padong was well underway, said President Kennedy was telling the people of the United States in a TV-radio address from the White House last night that Laos was in a critical situation.

Reporting on his talks in Paris, Vienna and London, Kennedy said both sides at Vienna recognized the need to reduce the dangers in the Laotian situation. Both sides endorsed the concept of a neutral and independent Laos.

"Of critical importance to the current conference on Laos in Geneva," Kennedy said, "both sides recognized the need for an effective cease-fire."

Princess Boum Oum, premier of the pro-western government who has been conferring with French authorities in Paris, announced he would head home within the next two days with some 400 American troops.

Congo's Only College Needs More Students

By PATRICK MASSEY
Leopoldville (U.P.)—On a high hill stands the Congo's first and only college, a scholarly haven from the havoc that torments the rest of the country.

Here at Lovanium University, scholars struggle to substitute learning for the ignorance and superstition that still flourish in the Congo 80 years after Henry Morton Stanley passed by on his expedition to open up a dark land.

To the great Congo youth, many of them from remote jungle villages who arrive to see modern tribal huts in order to learn about medicine, law, or modern science.

The violence that ripped the newly-independent Congo last July found little echo at Lovanium. It was examination time, the high mark meant much more than hot politics.

At times Congolese officials threatened to take over the university. But the students organized a guard roster to protect professors and sent delegations to the capital demanding non-interference with the university.

Lovanium was left in peace. And when Col. Joseph Mobutu overthrew Patrice Lumumba, he came to Lovanium seeking men to govern the country.

The faculty picked its brightest students and sent them to Leopoldville. The Mobutu regime ruled the Congo for five months.

Lovanium was founded in 1956 with the grudging approval of the Belgian colonial authorities, and two thirds larger. America's daily newspapers published 2,000,000,000 pages a day in 1960, a billion a day. Originally, it was a subsidiary of Ford and Rockefeller Foundations. Total daily circulation 31,700,000. It is now an independent institution and is now independent. It is operated by the Roman Catholic bishops of the Congo.

On-the-spot organization fell to Major Luc Gilson, the teaching busy clerk who is university president. He founded Lovanium on Remembrance Hill eight miles from Leopoldville.

The university opened with 33 students. Last year it had 480. Students of the July term, fall enrollment struck to 68 students—245 Congolese, 29 Europeans and 4 Africans from outside the Congo.

Like most folk, my mailbox is usually half-filled with direct mail advertising. Catalogues, letters, postcards, folders, coupons—all from people wanting to sell me something.

But do they have something to sell or that I am a prospective customer? No, they all want to "give" me something, or do me a great big favor, or let me in on a very special deal, or make me a member of a club, or give me a very special break.

They don't want anything from me—no indeed. They want to lead me to an easier life. They want to get an ad from somebody who comes right out and says, "We're out looking for new customers. For that rare bonanza and frank approach they're going to get a new customer, too...."

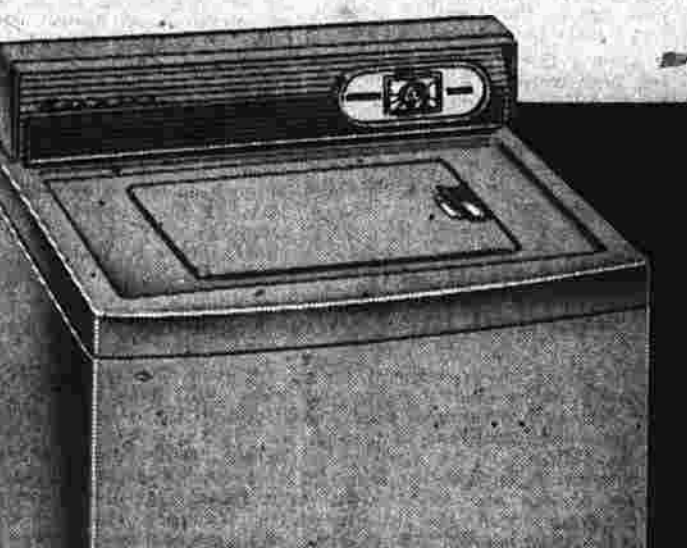
I hope they get a lot more with their honest sales pitch. For if they do—maybe the men who stay awake nights trying to figure out how to make a potential customer feel like a beneficiary will figure out that their's nothing wrong with honest selling.

And then we won't have to read a whole page of double talk before we finally find out what an advertiser is trying to sell. Isn't it amazing how refreshing a plain, honest sales message seems after all these years of the "newsworthy-to-do-you-a-favor" approach to advertising? (All rights reserved. 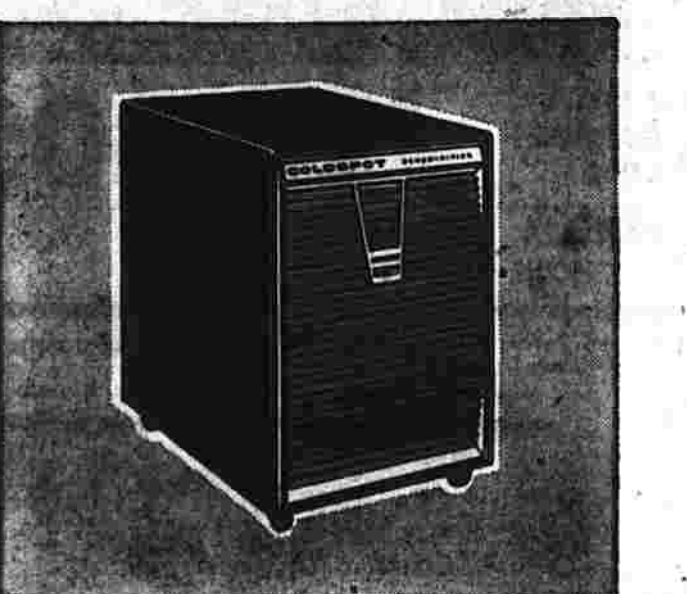

Emphasis On Health

Highway stress, a possible cause of cancer, a summertime hazard, and advice to grandparents are subjects for focus on health.

What May Cause Accident
For some people there is a definite wear and tear in driving at high speeds or in city traffic. German researchers found that out of a group of healthy persons, some show great changes in blood pressure and pulse rate after driving at 70 to 80 miles an hour, or after driving in traffic conditions. In these otherwise healthy persons, the appearance of these changes indicates borderline disorders, and may explain some faulty reactions that sometimes result in auto accidents, the researchers said.

TI Secrets
Certain non-toxic parts of the tuberculosis germ which help make animals more resistant to tuberculosis have also protected animals against several kinds of cancer, a University of California researcher reports.

The same bacterial fractions have protected animals against a number of bacterial infections as well, says Dr. David W. Waiss. Protection lasted three to six months.

Advice for Grandpa
With summertime here and visits to grandparents in order, a University of California psychiatrist has some advice: Grandparents should keep hands off in matters calling for discipline of a grandchild. Leave it to the parents. Grandparents are likely to be either too strict and rigid, or too overly indulgent to be able to help the parents, suggested Dr. Stuart Fink.

School May Not Be the Place For Intellectually Gifted Kids

By GARE KADOWITZ

New York — (NEA)—If you have an intellectually gifted child, you may be doing him a favor if you keep him out of school and educate him at home.

Mr. and Mrs. Daniel S. Tritan have just won the right to do that in a New Jersey court. They get strong support from members of the National Association of Gifted Children.

The Princeton University chemistry professor and his wife had been charged with being discriminatory persons for refusing to send their three gifted children to school. They won their case after demonstrating that the home-educated youngsters were at least three grades ahead of their age levels and were pursuing rigorous programs of musical study.

The members of the NAAG, queried during the group's recent New York convention, noted that "you have to be very brave to want to educate your child at home." But they also offered a variety of arguments to back up the practice.

Dr. Victor Goertzel, outgoing NAAG president, "As long as the child's schooling equivalence can be determined, parents have every right to educate their children as they see fit."

"A responsible citizen is as concerned about his child's education as he is with his off-spring's health and happiness."

"He delegates—he doesn't abdicate—his medical care when he takes his child to a doctor. You delegate as much and only as much responsibility as you believe necessary. This logically applies to education too."

Arthur R. Hughson, incoming NAAG president, "My son was taught at home during his first four years of schooling. He then started in the first grade and made up eight years in four."

Leah Gold Fain, consulting psychiatrist, Stamford, Conn.: "My children go to private school. Fortunately, I have the financial resources to send them. If I didn't, I would have trained them at home."

Those connected with the NAAG are particularly concerned about such problems and their ramifications because they know that they are not talking about a handful of individual "brilliant" or "few rare geniuses."

The group they refer to as intellectually gifted includes possibly eight million of our nation's "brightest."

Right now, educators are uncertain as to the best method to train these gifted children. But they generally agree that there are "very, very few" schools providing adequate schooling for the gifted.

Copenhagen — Denmark's 2,000 mink farmers supplied the world market last year with 700,000 pelts and this year expect to export 800,000 to 25 countries. The United States, the largest customer, takes 75 per cent of the exports. Other important customers are France, Italy, and Germany.

Most of the mink farms in Denmark are small: 80 per cent have fewer than 100 breeding animals. It takes about 80 male mink furs or 90 female pelts to make a woman's coat. But only 10 per cent of the furs are used for making coats; the others go into stoles, jackets, capes, collars, bows, and trimmings.

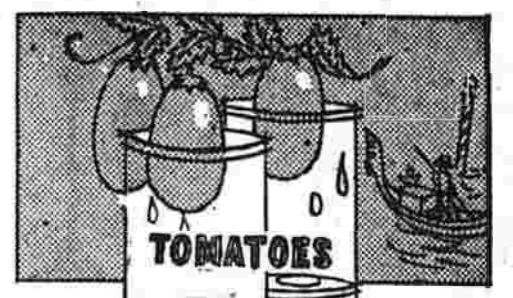

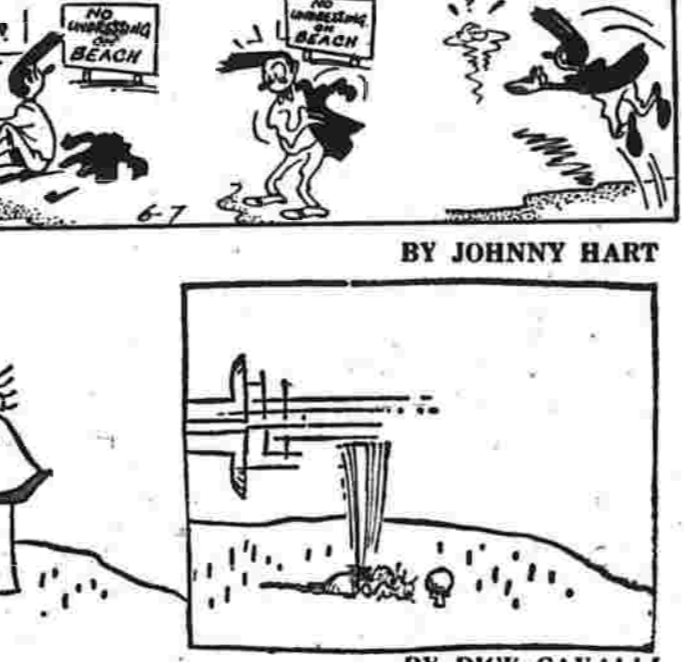
