This is the conclusion of FBI agents after years of tracking fugitives by the pictures and words tattooed on their bodies.

Nobody seems to know why so many criminals have themselves decorated with words and pictures, but the practice is common among decorated with words and pictures, but the practice is common among lawbreakers from the petty to the felonious. Five of the FBI's Ten Most Wanted Criminals have giveawy tattoos.

Agents say that initials are the favorite markings. Names and nicknames of girl friends come next. Other favorites are the American flag and hearts with initials.

Man criminals honor their mothers with a blue tombstone and the words "In Memory of Mother" or two roses with "Mother, Rose of Mine." Birds, snakes, butterflys and black cats are also common.

Agents won't be surprised if tattoos lead to the arrest of five of their most wanted criminals. The fugitives and their lattoos are:
