### Rockville-Vernon District Budget Voted After Cut of \$6,460

Vernon Fire District meeting July 25 so that Vernon will spend two hours in awaiting the results of the district budget, which they eventually passed with a \$6,460 cut.

At meeting's end, voters approved a tax rate for the coming year of four and a half mills, a two-mill increase over last year's rate.

The tax rate was voted after District Council Robert D. King explained that the Board of Fire District Commissioners is empowered to set the rate, and that it has only been a "provisional" rate. He warned that rates might result if the rate should be lowered.

The rate is calculated mathematically by dividing the district's total budget into the adopted budget figure, he pointed out.

Frederic P. Paisley, former district tax collector, offered a motion to knock a half mill off the proposed rate, but the rate was approved 60 to 25 by the rapidly dwindling assembly.

Falsely and others argued that the high budget and tax rate increase are too much to dump on the district in one motion.

However, the budget had already been approved and the tax rate was based on it.

The big district resulted largely from a \$4,100 appropriation for police services, a sum to be paid, the town of Vernon government under contract.

Although controversy over budget items was not expected, it arose largely over the police item.

About 200 people attended the annual district meeting, held at the Vernon Elementary School and packed the auditorium. Residents felt the turnout was larger than expected.

His most severely in the police budget items was a proposed \$13,140 for full time dispatchers to cover police fire and emergency calls on a 24-hour basis at the Public Safety Building.

At present, Constable Edmund F. Dwyer said, constables are used as dispatchers and only during two shifts a day. The mid-night shift is covered by the assistant operators at Toland State Jail.

A motion to turn back the dispatcher item was voted down and the full appropriation went under.

Under the contractual arrangement with the town, the fire district pays the town for administering the rural constabulary.

### Rockville-Vernon Fire District To Get New Alarm System

The Vernon Fire District fire companies will benefit in the near future from an alarm system designed to speed up response to fire calls and to coordinate all emergency calls in the district.

John P. McKeown, retiring district commissioner, outlined the emergency fire number district voters at last night's annual meeting.

With an appropriation of \$2,500 approved for the system, it is a matter of time before it is installed.

The new alarm system will consist mainly of a special telephone network connecting the fire chief and company officers' homes to the fire station.

At the same time, the Vernon constabulary service will take over control of a central dispatching service at the Public Safety Building.

All police and fire calls will be handled by the state fire marshal's office, he said.

At present, fire emergency calls are answered by nurses on duty at the Vernon Haven convalescent home in Vernon Center.

Smith said he would welcome opinions from both political parties and non-partisan groups regarding separating the office of selectman from the road foreman's job in particular, and from any other job paid for by town tax money in general.

Smith pointed out that "as chief administrators of the town, the selectmen are charged with the responsibility of seeing that the taxpayer's money is spent wisely."

If a selectman is also the road foreman, he is in the peculiar position of being answerable only to himself for the spending of funds which account for the greatest part of his budget.

Smith feels that the town should hire a road foreman to supervise town employees and to work in conjunction with the state engineer on those jobs involving matching funds.

Edward P. Williams, president of the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) yesterday that his firm's taxes were increased 165 per cent.

The underlying crisis of our generation, said Secretary of State Dean Rusk in his address before the National Press Club yesterday, "arises from the fact that the Soviet Union did not join the United Nations as a free member, but as a satellite of the United States."

If that statement could be taken out of an application altogether, too narrow and too self-righteous for even cold war oratory, and applied, instead, to all whom it might be applied, it would stand as all too true.

The underlying crisis of our generation arises from the fact that no great nation has as yet bowed its national will to the will of its world.

We, no less than Russia, instead upon the big power veto as a part of the United Nations Charter structure.

And it was not Russia, but we who insisted that the Charter be so written as to tolerate regional armed alliances of such nature as to pose an inevitable challenge to the prestige and power of the United Nations.

We had our own view of the American States already in existence as one special exception to the priority of the United Nations alliance against war. We soon followed that up with NATO and then our other regional power lines.

Both we and Russia have subsequently been picking and choosing those moments when we preferred to act like members of the United Nations, and those moments when we preferred to ignore the fact that it existed.

We found the United Nations inavertable and indeed irreplaceable in Korea, in the Suez Canal, and in the Congo, and in each instance achieved a high point of United States policy by standing for right principles and for the concept of world law, which was sometimes being enforced against the misdeeds of Communism and sometimes against those of our own friends.

But we preferred action which ignored the existence of the United Nations when it came to Guatemala, or to the landing of Marines in Lebanon, or to the recommendation of the United Nations Secretary General, or to Laos, where we thought we might make a cold war advance on our own, or to Cuba, a subject on which we have proclaimed negotiation impossible.

Nor are we and Russia alone in neglecting the jurisdiction of the United Nations and our own duties to our membership in it, when it comes to some matter in which a great nation feels that its own vital interest might be served more fully from the whole world family of nations.

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**120 at Demonstration On Rescue Breathing**

About 120 persons last night at Sailer's Pool learned what to do for a drowning or choking victim until a rescuer gets there, and the right and wrong ways to do it.

The group witnessed a demonstration of mouth-to-mouth and mouth-to-nose rescue breathing techniques which have been acclaimed as the most effective methods for immediate aid to a victim.

Presenting the demonstration, which included several mock rescues and a sound film, were Assistant Fire Chief Sedrick Straughan, who is also a Red Cross first aid instructor; Eighth District Fire Chief John R. Kelly; Thomas Kelly, chief lifeguard at Sailer's Pool; Peter Beckwith, a fireman; and Joseph McCool, a fireman and chairman of the 22 first aid instructors.

Beckwith was the "victim" for the demonstration. After several "rescues" by Kelly from the pool, Straughan reviewed him by mouth-to-mouth and mouth-to-nose resuscitation through use of a plastic resuscitator.

Straughan illustrated two methods of artificial respiration, the "Sylvester method" and "back pressure and arm lift method."

Mrs. Nixon was the "victim" for the demonstration. After several "rescues" by Kelly from the pool, Straughan reviewed her by mouth-to-mouth and mouth-to-nose resuscitation through use of a plastic resuscitator.

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**Chambers Dies At 60; Ex-Red, Hiss Accused**

Richard M. Nixon won a reputation as an anti-Communist crusader as a result, and the incident generally is credited with starting his political career which led to the Republican nomination for president in 1960.

Informing of Chambers' death, Nixon said it was "one of the great tragedies of our time that a man of Whitaker Chambers' extraordinary abilities became involved in the Communist conspiracy."

But Nixon said it was courage which led him to break with the conspiracy "more than atoned for his earlier mistakes."

Chambers resigned his post as a \$30,000-a-year senior editor with Time Magazine after admitting his right hand in the Rosenberg case and was a Communist party member for 14 years.

For making the admission, he was described by Federal Judge Thomas F. Murphy as a "conscious man."

In 1952 Chambers suffered the first of a series of heart attacks and was bedridden for many months.

He suffered another in October 1955, but had received sufficient aid by Jan. 17, 1957, to help carry out his duties at the magazine.

Chambers had been a fulltime student at Western Maryland College for the past 2 1/2 years where he was described by faculty members as a brilliant student who rarely was given a grade below "A."

He needed only 10 semester hours to be graduated with a degree in French and had hoped to do graduate work.

John Myers, general director who informed the Associated Press of the death, said Mrs. Chambers had been bedridden for many months.

And they accepted the \$180,000 renovation project for elementary school No. 1.

The directors confirmed the sale of \$1,150,000 in bonds for three other projects, including the \$400,000 school alteration project and the \$350,000 addition to Mary Chery Library.

### 72 Killed In Czech Airliner

The sole survivor, not immediately identified, was taken to a Cambalanga Hospital with severe burns and was reported in critical condition.

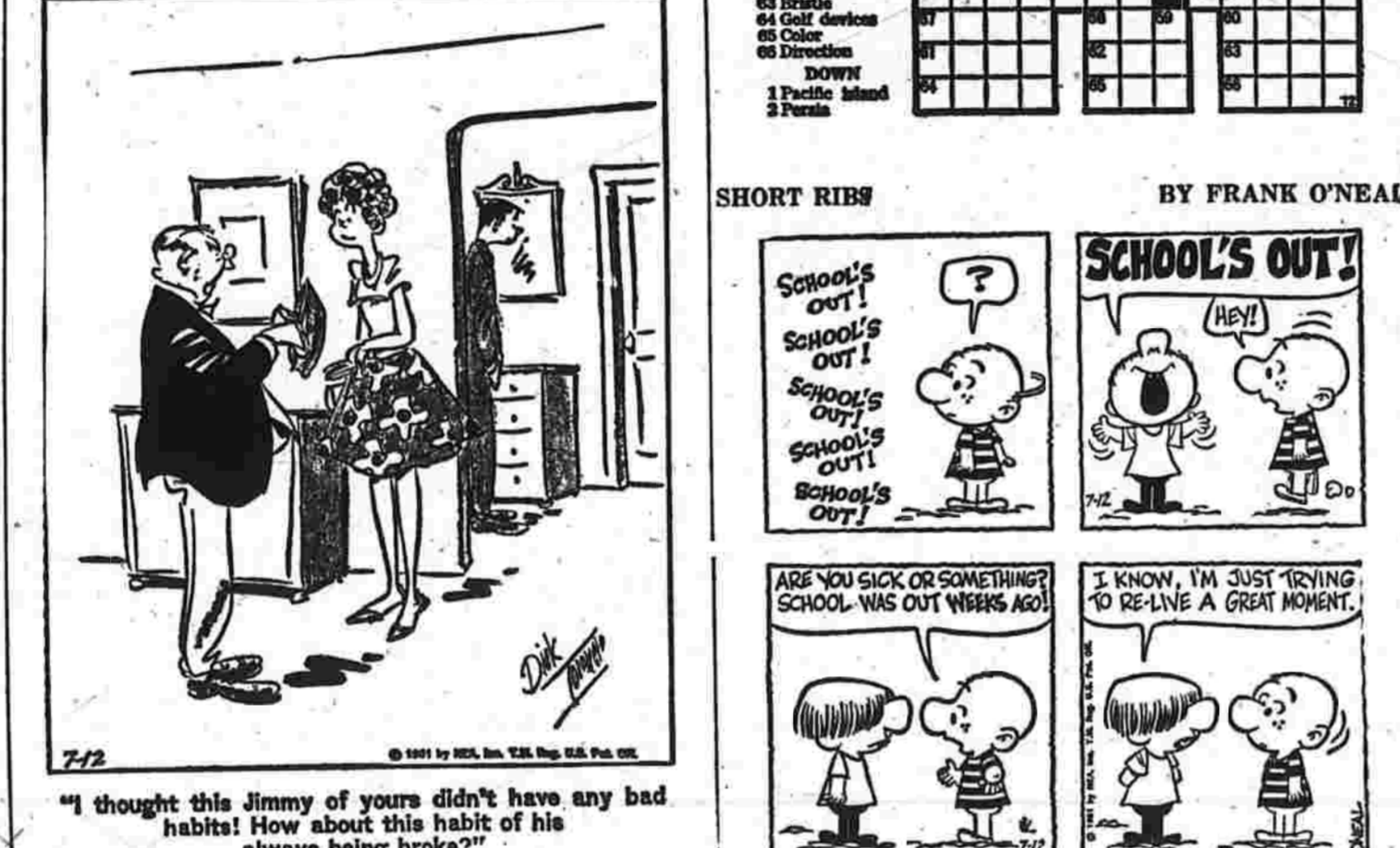
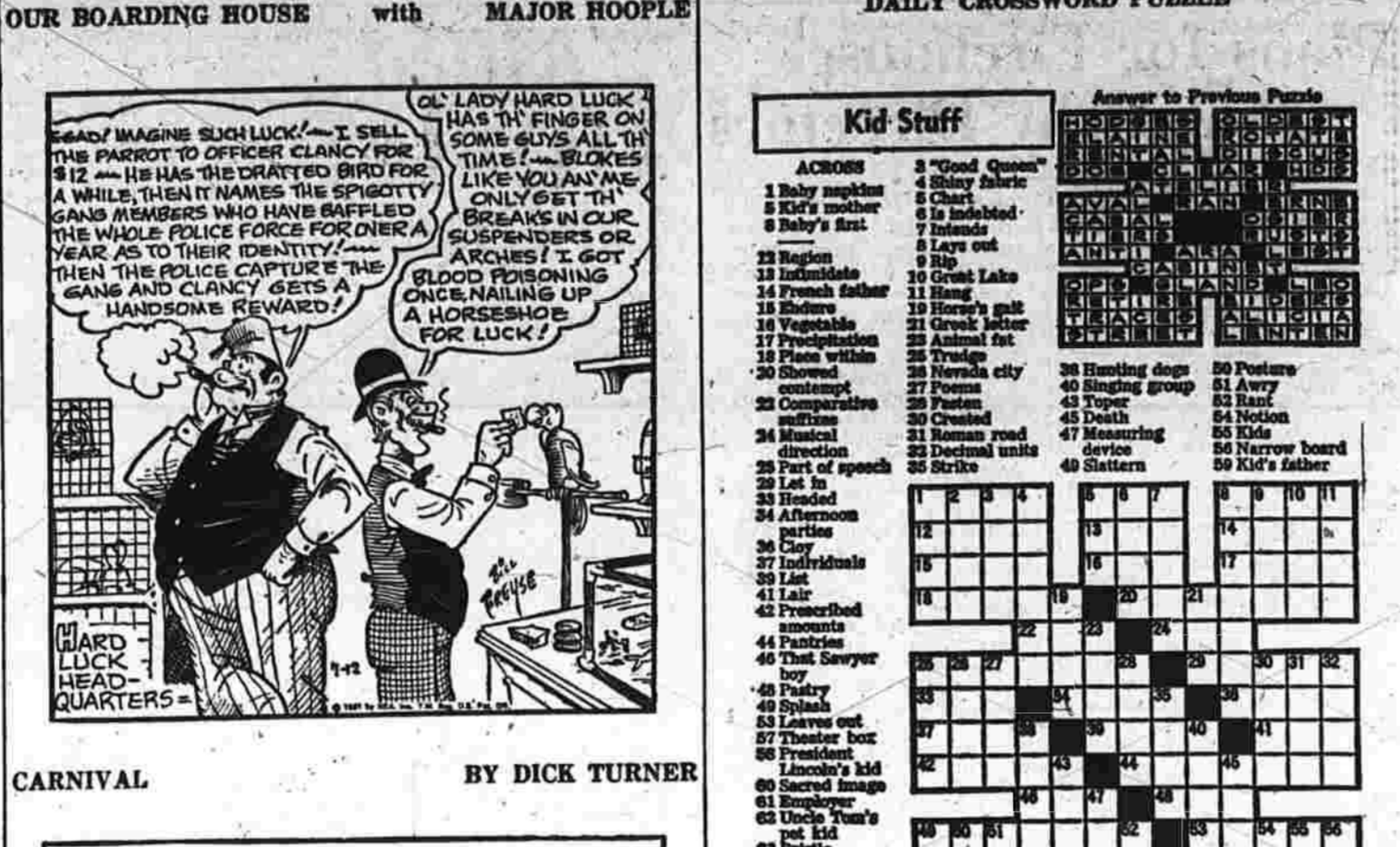

Directors Bar Hearing On School Budget Hike

If the board of education wants any of the \$266,000 which was cut from its 1961-62 budget, it will have to secure the signatures of five per cent of the electorate on a petition to the board of directors.

A majority of the directors voted last night not to have a special hearing on returning the money, although a number of directors requested that the hearing be held.

Five Republicans voted against holding a special hearing, and three Democrats voted for it. The sixth Republican, Francis Dellaferra, was absent.

While most of the arguments, both for and against holding the hearing, were repeats of earlier arguments, one new idea was introduced by General Manager Richard Martin who said that if the directors were going to consider restoring the money cut from the education budget, he wanted them to consider restoring every other cut they made in every department.

The motion to hold the hearing which was defeated was made by Democrat Ted Powell, who included mention of restoring \$30,000.

\$266,000 Was Cut The board of education requested \$4,453,469 in February for the 1961-62 fiscal year. The general manager recommended \$4,228,400. In May the board of directors appropriated \$4,156,947, about \$266,000 less than the original request.

Directors justified the cut by saying the amount allocated was \$305,000 more than the 1960-61 fiscal year, despite the fact there has been no pupil increase.

The board of education protested that the educational program would be hurt badly. The directors retorted that even with the cut, the board of education was still adding 15 teachers and wanted raising salary schedules of all education employees. The board of education continued to press for restoration of some of the cut.

Then the state legislature increased the per pupil grant in state aid to each town. The directors, who had anticipated that the legislature would increase Manchester's grant by \$200,000, found they had \$41,000 more than that on their hands.

The board of education asked for a meeting with the directors to consider restoring at least the unanticipated \$41,000.

The republican majority of the directors said the state aid was meant to relieve taxpayers who support education in general and not necessarily to help the board of education directly.

The amount of income should have little relation to the size of the education budget, said Mayor Harold Turkington.

Would Not Have Cut "If the town had received \$150,000 instead of \$200,000, I would have opposed any motion to reduce the board of education budget," he said.

"If we appropriate more now... it's a strong admission we weren't honest (when first considering the budget)," he said.

The board of education must secure the signatures of five per cent of the electorate on a petition for the money, he said. The town can hold a referendum on the question.

"If the people say they want to pay \$300,000 more for education, that's okay with me."

He said he had not had a single telephone call from an elector, urging him to support the restoration. "And I haven't seen any letters in the paper."

Radio station WTNF has planned a Smart Shopper event, whereby anyone may estimate the value of prizes donated by the retail division members.

A window set aside at House & Hale's Department Store will display some 40 gifts. Shoppers may estimate the total value of the window display and submit a post card to the radio station no later than midnight, this Sunday. The winner will be announced at a later date.

Arrests in June Lower Than May

The police department reports a marked decrease in arrests from May to June.

There were only 47 arrests reported in June, compared to 92 in May.

The greatest decrease was in arrests for defective motor equipment. There were 24 arrests during May, when the State police conducted spot checks on motor vehicles, compared to only one in June.

The greatest increase in arrests was for breach of peace. There were 9 arrests in May and 14 in June. The number of arrests for intoxication remained the same, 15.

The number of accidents decreased from 62 in May to 60 in June.

The number of complaints processed decreased from 410 in May to 388 in June.

There were 694 parking tickets issued in May, and a decrease to 646 in June.

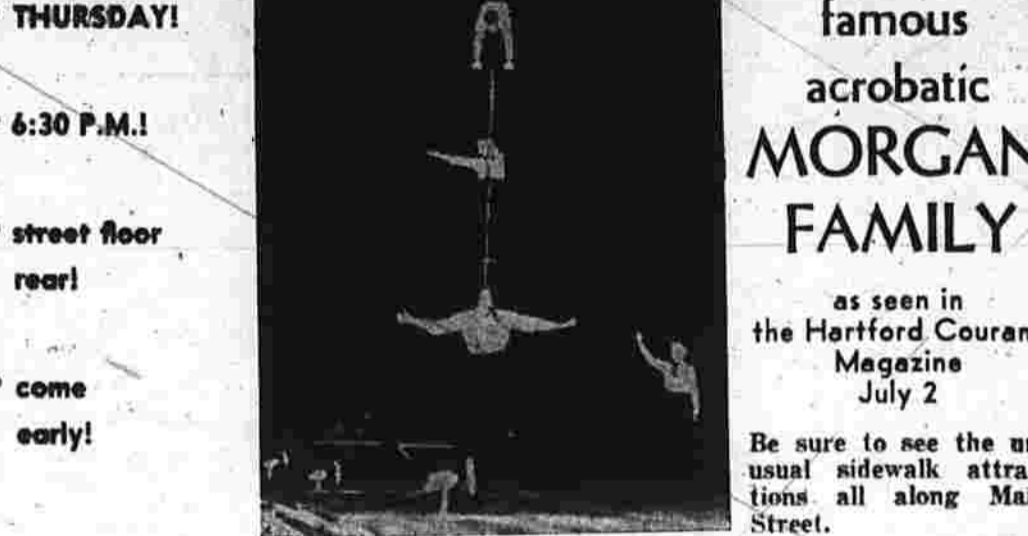

Doctor Claims Human Senses Survive Death

Charlottesville, Va., July 13 (AP)—Are there persons, living today who lived another life, in another body — perhaps in some bygone century?

A psychiatrist at the University of Virginia isn't sure, but he says he has found enough evidence in a 10-year study to warrant further investigation.

For additional research he is leaving Saturday for India and Ceylon, where several children claim to have memories of another life.

The doctor, Ian Stevenson, is professor of neurology and psychiatry and chairman of that department at the university's School of Medicine. He will work under a grant from the Parapsychology Foundation in New York.

He says succinctly, "There is some evidence that part of the human organism survives physical death."

He says he is not referring to any organic part of the body, but "to what was called the soul in the 19th Century."

Parapsychology — the study of mental telepathy, clairvoyance and extrasensory perception — first captured his imagination as a boy, but it was only in the last 10 years that he has been able to investigate it thoroughly.

Dr. Stevenson is a leader in the study of possible survival of the human senses after death.

Speaking of case studies of children who claim to have lived before, Dr. Stevenson says, "Apparent memories of this kind are fragmentary, and usually fade as the children get older. Such children usually remember from a dozen to 20 items, and these are usually scenes of strong emotional significance, such as the death of a mother or father."

Dr. Stevenson said he hopes to

Kennedy Urges Aide Seek New East-West Arms Talk

De Gaulle Hits Reds On Berlin

Paris, July 13 (AP)—President Charles de Gaulle said last night the West will never let the Soviet Union settle the fate of Berlin alone "as if the three great powers had no rights there."

The French leader in a television speech warned the Russians they are creating a crisis over the former German capital that threatens the peace of the world.

De Gaulle charged the Russians with calling for peace "while formulating requirements which threaten to put it in danger."

"The Soviets are renewing their threat of unilaterally settling the fate of Berlin... If Washington, London and Paris do not give up the present status of the town as required by Moscow," he said, then warned:

"I declare once more, there is no chance of this being accepted."

He further warned the Soviet Union it must bear the full responsibility for any "grave consequences" of a crisis over Berlin. At the same time he called for an atmosphere of true cooperation and coexistence in which "a problem like that of Germany would lose much of its bitterness and might, at some moment, be considered objectively by the interested powers."

De Gaulle told his own people that France must speedily purchase modern arms to replace the World War II weapons that most of her forces have. Starting in September, he said, the length of French drafts' military service will be cut by an unspecified number of weeks, and funds thus saved will be used to modernize the army.

Moscow Radio said De Gaulle's remarks on Berlin "repeated U.S. and West German propaganda, crudely distorting the Soviet position. The broadcast said the French leader proposed 'to prolong the occupation there, keeping West Berlin as a central provocation in the heart of Europe.'"

In Moscow, meanwhile, the West German government told the Russians it must speedily purchase modern arms to replace the World War II weapons that most of her forces have.

The West German note replied to a Soviet note proposing that separate peace treaties be signed with West Germany and Communist East Germany. Bonn replied that a peace treaty must be concluded with a legitimate German government.

The chancellor did not mention West Berlin, but he was obviously referring to the fear that this escape route might be closed by the Communists in this city 100 miles behind the Iron Curtain.

Refugees now cross easily from East Berlin to West Berlin and are flown to West Germany. Soviet threats to hand over more authority to East Germany have encouraged the Red regime there to demand control over air corridors to West Berlin. This would close the refugee escape hatch.

The flight of refugees streamed into the "Escape Hatch" from Communist East Germany at the rate of more than 1,000 a day—the highest in eight years.

Adenauer, visiting West Berlin to demonstrate the close links between the isolated city and West Germany, said today that the flight of refugees is a "demonstration of the close links between the isolated city and West Germany."

1,000 Flee West Daily Adenauer Reports East Reich 'Panic'

Berlin, July 13 (AP)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer said today the heavy flow of refugees into West Berlin indicates the Communist East German regime is stepping up pressure on its citizens.

"The refugee situation proves that conditions over there have become unbearable," the West German leader told a news conference. "A panic seems to have broken out."

Adenauer observed that many East Germans seem to feel they must escape now before political developments make flight impossible. He added that "we must do all we can to help" fellow Germans living under Communist rule.

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Plane Crash Film Shows Arrival of First Fire Trucks

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS A St. Louis executive shot 150 feet of movie film of the Denver airliner crash which he said today shows "it was at least 10 minutes before the first fire truck arrived on the scene."

Dee Belveal, vice president of Reardon Co., a paint making firm, said he grabbed his camera loaded with 30 feet of film from a locker, rushed out to the observation platform and started shooting the crash scene. He used a telephoto lens, and stopped only long enough to load another 100 feet of film.

"The helicopter arrived at the scene and people were jumping out of the burning plane before the first fire truck arrived," Belveal said.

"Then it appeared they poured water on the fire at first, which only made it worse because it was an oil fire."

"It seems to me they had enough advance warning for some fire trucks to arrive from the city... If the pilot circled the field."

"I'm a pilot myself and if many other airports aren't better equipped I'm going to stock up on luck charms," he said.

U.S., Reds To Confer On Dates

By JOHN M. HIGHTOWER Washington, July 13 (AP)—President Kennedy gave final instructions to his top disarmament adviser today for a new round of negotiations with Russia on setting up a big new international disarmament conference this summer.

The President was understood to have told Disarmament chief John J. McCloy that he should make every possible effort in talks beginning at Moscow Monday to work out arrangements for a new East-West meeting on this critical issue, including details of time, place and the nations which would be invited to attend.

Kennedy's meeting with McCloy and Secretary of State Dean Rusk was one of two major foreign policy sessions on his calendar today; the other was a late afternoon meeting of the National Security Council reportedly called to deal with plans for meeting Russia's threats against West Berlin. Rusk and other policy makers were summoned to the NSC session.

The last such meeting on Berlin came two weeks ago. At that time Kennedy assigned to Rusk, Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara and other administration executives various aspects of the Berlin crisis. They were told to come up with plans and recommendations for meeting the Soviet challenge.

U.S. RAPS EAST REDS Washington, July 13 (AP)—The United States accused East Germany's Communist regime today of violating religious liberty and trying to split the Evangelical Church of Germany.

EICHMANN SHIFTS STORY Jerusalem, July 13 (AP)—Adolf Eichmann admitted on the witness stand today that 55 officers assigned to deport Jews to Nazi death camps from occupied countries in Europe got their orders from him. This was a startling shift from the former Gestapo officer's repeated assertions that he only passed along instructions from above and that subordinates in the field were not his own men and often acted on orders from others.

TIROS Faces Test In Hurricane Zone; Midas over Russia

Cape Canaveral, Fla., July 13 (AP)—A weather disturbance in the Atlantic could provide a quick test for the new camera-carrying TIROS III Hurricane-Hunter satellite.

The 235-pound satellite rocketed into orbit yesterday to photograph and perhaps discover the cause of tropical storms brewing in the 1961 season. Within hours, the Miami Weather Bureau reported a disturbance southeast of Puerto Rico, 400-600 miles east of the Lesser Antilles.
