Vatican City, July 14 (A)-In a wide-ranging new encyclical on social problems of the modern world, Pope John XXIII called today for industry to limit profits and make sure that the working man receives a wage that allows him to live in dignity.

The encyclical, at 25,000 words the longest in the history of the Roman Catholic Church, said the plight of backward nations is "perhaps the major problem of the modern epoch." The Pope called for advanced states to give sincere and disinterested aid to the underdeveloped in the cause of "fruit-

ful and lasting" peace.

He reaffirmed the Roman Catholic Church's traditional stand on the rights of private property, but declared socialization does not turn men into automatons if it "confines its activity within the limits of the moral order."
