TOO MUCH WEALTH MAY EMBARRASS YOU

Only the rich man is worried about burglars. Only the player with values in two places is worried about burglars.

Declarer won the first trick in dummy with the ace of spades and hit upon the idea of leading a diamond from dummy rather than a club to East's ace and get a spade return, just as he wished.

South finessed the jack of spades to the queen, and West returned the eight of spades to force out the king. West shrewdly kept the three of spades to make sure of having an entry to his partner's spades.

Russ Clubs

Now South ran the clubs. West had to find two discards, and only the first was easy. West threw the low diamond without pain, but his next discard was sheer torture.

West couldn't throw the ace of diamonds since that would give South the rest of the tricks. West couldn't throw a heart, since that would give dummy an extra heart trick.

After some agonized thought, West discarded the three of spades. By this time South had no doubt as to what was going on. He gave up a diamond to the ace and won the rest when West was unable to lead a spade.

Curiously enough, the result would be different if declarer had led the club at the second trick instead of leading a diamond. East steps up with the ace of clubs and clears the spades. Now when South leads the club, West can discard the five of diamonds and the king of diamonds!

Water Samples Pass State Test

Water in three reservoirs and a pump station in Manchester were certified as safe for drinking purposes, after a periodic test of samples by the Connecticut State Department of Health lab service.

Samples were tested from the Charter Oak pump station, Porter Reservoir, Roaring Brook Reservoir and Highland Park Reservoir on July 11.

State reports received at the Manchester Health Department office today noted that the figure for color is slightly high for a sample of water from a public supply, on the basis of a sample from Porter Reservoir taken at the tap at the Highland Park School. Color can be caused by iron or organic matter. However, all samples had less than 22 color units per million, which is considered a desirable standard.

William Ferguson, who sat with Benson at the news conference, why did he make a false confession?

"Well, I just told them that."

"What about the old scars he brought to life among former and friends of the victims?"

"I wish I could ask for forgiveness, but that's too much to ask."

Benson added:

"I've dreamed about it about my sister." His 14-year-old sister was killed in the explosion.

Officers escorted Benson here last night from Oklahoma City. He was placed in a third-floor cell of the county jail at 12:30 a.m. after Oklahoma officials turned him over to Texas authorities for investigation of the bombing story he told in Oklahoma City after his arrest in a \$38 case robbery.

The jail is 9 miles from New London where the chunky, 41-year-old ex-convict and former mental patient attended school as a boy.

Benson, red-headed and slightly over 5 1/2 feet tall, now lives in Oklahoma. In a signed statement after his arrest Monday night, he claimed responsibility for the New London disaster.

The blast was believed to have been set off by a spark from an electric switch in the manual training room of theatory structure. The school at the time was known as the N. S. Mean school in the world.

The disaster that killed 762 children and 14 teachers. The blast came a scant 30 minutes before school was to be dismissed for the day.

Benson's 14-year-old sister and cousin were among the victims.

The ex-convict said he was absent the day of the blast but hurried to the scene to help in the rescue work.

Benson said he confessed to get it off his conscience.
