# Good Show for Kids

has treated children with great disrespect," says Lucian Kaminsky.
He and Phyllis and Jack Spear are now attempting to do something about that with their successful NBC children's show, "Pip the Piper."

For many children who have grown up in the last few years it may be too late. Their TV fare has been The Three Stooges, some old cartoons and a pitifully few good shows such as Captain Kangaroo.

The success of "Pip the Piper" may change all that. It may lead to children being treated with the respect Kaminsky feels is due

"All Madison Avenue has done," Kaminsky feels, "is to say, 'Well, we'll give the kids something fast, and somebody hitting somebody over the head with something, and they'll like it.' They don't realize if you give children something a bit over their heads, they'll reach up for it."

Kaminsky and the Spears entered television as disgruntled parents with no professional show business experience. They all lived in West Orange, N. Almost inevitably, they came up with an outline for a children's show, which would, first and foret, entertain the children, but which also would have something to tell them.

It took several years to work out. There was a lot of perfume over the dram and baby pictures snapped before "Pip the Piper" evolved and gained its Saturday

morning network spot.

As it now stands, Jack Spear is Pip (a distant relative of both The Pied Piper and Peter Pan) who lives in Pipertown, plays the pipe and flies about on a cloud. His wife, Phyllis, is Miss Merrynote who plays piano, sings, dances. Kaminsky is Mr. Leader and the voice for such odds and ends as talking fish and stuffed owls who figure prominently in the

goings-on.
They sing songs, cavort, and toss in bits of useful information. Above all, they amuse the children.

It is definitely a step in the right direction. Another step would be to resurrect some other valuable children's shows, such as "Let's Take a Trip." The three admit



that they aren't even sure if they're right about what they're doing. But they think they are and at least they're trying. For three non-pros, this is all pretty heady stuff, and they're en-

joying life as semi-stars. They do personal appearances, are about to make records, will have some 75 "Pip the Piper" products on the market by the fall. They are thinking seriously in terms of an adult show and of writing a musical comedy.

They still live in West Orange, where the neighborhood is excited about the stars which bloomed in their suburban midst.
