8 Tractor-Prisoner Envoys Flying Back To Castro, 2 Remain

Miami, Fla., July 31 (AP)—Eight tractor-prisoner envoys flew back to Fidel Castro's jails today, declaring confidently "We shall return." More than 600 Cuban exiles cheered them loudly at Miami International Airport. Two members of the delegation that came to implement Castro's pledge to swap 1,200 Cuban prisoners for tractors remained behind. Reinaldo Pico, 27, and Mirto Colazo, 26, claimed Castro reneged on his offer. Pico, in explaining his decision not to return to Cuba, said Castro "has no intention of releasing all the prisoners" no matter how much money or how many tractors he gets and that the negotiating team knows of at least 16 of the 1,197 who will not be freed. Pico added, "I would take the full 500 tractors or some \$20 million to gain the release of some prisoners, and all they've been able to raise here in a month is \$140,000. With the eight aboard a regular airliner went a delegation of three from the Cuban Families Tractor Committee. They plan to confer with Castro regarding plans to exchange prisoners piecemeal as ransom tractors become available. The committee, composed of relatives of prisoners, has been raising funds for the tractors.

The exile crowd boomed when a man they recognized as a Cuban G-2 (secret police) agent boarded the same plane as a passenger. The exiles yelled, "Chivato" (informant). Ulises Carbo, spokesman for the eight prisoners, declared, "It is tough to go back. But I know that we shall return. We have a very (Continued on Page Four)

Will He Risk Goals in War? Nikita's Utopia Promise Raises Hopes for Peace

By ANTHONY WHITE London, July 31 (AP)—The Soviet communist party's promise of a Golden Age ahead for the Russian people evoked mixed feelings of skepticism and hope in western Europe today. Skepticism at the grandiose ideas outlined in the Communist blueprint for a coming Utopia for the Soviet's millions; hope aroused by the rejection of war and the declaration that to realize this easy life there must be peace on Earth. Belief was expressed in Britain that Premier Khrushchev would not be prepared to gamble away his goals of a Communist paradise by risking war with the West. But Belgian Socialists saw the program as partly a political maneuver. And a Swedish conservative newspaper, Svenska Dagbladet, said the promised achievements are "so long-dated... that it must be safe for Khrushchev to feel that it can hardly be he who will have to answer if they are not redeemed." The 20-year plan made public over the weekend declared that by 1970 Russia would outdistance the United States in per capita production and by 1980 would give the Soviet people the highest standard of living in the world — "everyone will live in easy circumstances." The Russian people were promised free housing, a public transportation in the 1970's, a gradual shortening of the work-week to 5 hours a day, and before completion of the program free education, free medical care, free gas and heating and free water. The 45,000-word manifesto—the first grand Soviet plan since Lenin's in 1919—pledged a policy of coexistence with the West in an apparent slap at the Chinese Communists. Surgeons Work To Save Life of Wounded Child

New Haven, July 31 (AP)—A 3 1/2-year-old girl, shot in the neck by her father before he committed suicide, was in critical condition at Grace-New Haven Community Hospital today. Surgeons worked several hours into the early morning today trying to save the life of Anna Maldonado, who was wounded by her father, Carmelo, 48, during a shooting spree that climaxed a quarrel with his estranged wife. The wife, Antonia, 20, who is four months pregnant, was hit in the hand during the rampage that ended when Carmelo put a bullet into his head. Mrs. Maldonado's condition was listed as fair at the hospital. Police said the quarrel at Mrs. Maldonado's apartment 51 North-east Dr. was apparently about a separation settlement. The couple have been living apart for several months. Two other children of the couple, Carlos, 4, and Ada, 8 months, were unharmed although Maldonado sprayed nine shots from a 22-caliber pistol around the apartment. Maldonado, a dishwasher, was lying dead across the threshold of the apartment when the police arrived. His wounded daughter sat beside him, crying. Mrs. Maldonado had fled to a neighbor's apartment where she summoned help.

Afro-Asians In UN Split On Session

United Nations, N. Y., July 31 (AP)—The 46 Asian-African members of the U.N. appeared today over whether to press for a special session of the U.N. General Assembly to take up the French-Tunisian impasse over the Bizerte naval base.

A number of countries from both Asia and Africa were reported reluctant to support Libyia's call for a special August session. The group called a closed-door meeting this afternoon. There was considerable doubt the 10 new African nations who belong to the French community would go along with the proposal. The goal of those seeking special assembly is to brand France an aggressor against Tunisia and to force the French out of their Mediterranean naval and air base at Bizerte. Tunisia, the Philippines and several other Asian members of the bloc were reported dubious of the advantage of a special assembly unless new violence erupts in Tunisia. If the bloc unanimously supports the proposal, a special assembly is virtually certain. It requires 50 member signatures to convene the 99-nation body and the 23-nation bloc is expected to support the move. So are Yugoslavia and Cuba. Assembly President Frederick H. Brand reportedly received word in Dublin to be ready to return to New York at once if the members decide to place the Tunisian crisis before the assembly. Liberian Ambassador Nathan Barnes announced he would seek support for special assembly debate on Tunisia after the Security Council failed Saturday to take any action on Tunisia's aggression charges. The council had issued a ceasefire call July 22 to stop the fighting between French and Tunisian troops around Bizerte base and in the Sahara south of Tunisia. The council also called on all troops to return to positions they held before fighting broke July 1. Tunisia has accused France of continuing aggression and of refusing to pull back her troops in Bizerte. France is demanding guarantees that her communications lines to Bizerte will be safeguarded between its units will be safeguarded. Reds Activate Berlin Planes Curbs Tonight

Berlin, July 31 (AP)—New Communist rules go into effect tonight that could make trouble for western planes flying into and out of Berlin. But U.S. officials say they do not expect any incidents. The rules were issued by the Communist East German regime, which occupies the territory surrounding the city. They call for planes crossing this territory to report to the East German Air Safety Center when they enter and when they leave. Effective date of the regulation is Aug. 1. Western planes flying into Berlin cross East Germany in one of three corridors by agreement with the Soviet Union. The western powers do not recognize the East German regime, much less any right it may assume to control air traffic. Air traffic into Berlin is handled by a special Air Safety Center. Insurance Chief Hits Care for Aged Costs

Washington, July 31 (AP)—An insurance industry spokesman told Congress today President Kennedy's program of health care for the aged under Social Security would cost more than double what the administration estimates. But a spokesman for the American Public Welfare Association backed the Kennedy proposal, saying voluntary insurance programs are unable to handle the problem. H. Lewis Rietz, Houston, Tex., insurance executive and representative of the American Life Convention, Health Insurance Association of America and Life Insurance Association of America, put these price tags on the hospitalization and nursing home program: By 1965, \$2.2 billion as against \$1.1 billion estimated by 1963 \$5.4 billion against \$2.5 billion. Rietz said his figures were based on actuarial studies. He termed as "unrealistic" the proposed financing of the program—a 1/2 of 1 per cent tax, shared by employers and employees, on a \$5,000 payroll basis. Rietz testified before the House Ways and Means Committee, which has the administration plan under consideration, although action is not expected before next year. He contended that voluntary health insurance is steadily providing for a greater proportion of the aged. He estimated that 53 per cent of Americans over 65 and not in institutions have some form of voluntary health coverage now, compared with 26 per cent in 1952. Counting those who receive health care under old age assistance and similar programs, Rietz said, "It becomes clear that well over two thirds of the present aged are protected for health care cost." Presenting an opposite view, former Social Security Commissioner Charles E. Schottland, speaking for the American Public Welfare Association, told the committee: "There is no question that voluntary insurance for the aged has made tremendous progress in the United States. There is also no question... that it cannot provide the solution to the total problem of medical care for the aged." Schottland said that despite enactment last year of a bill expanding the federal-state old age pro-

McCloy to Give Kennedy Ideas Of Red Leader

Washington, July 31 (AP)—John J. McCloy will report to President Kennedy tonight on his discussions last week with Soviet Premier Khrushchev on disarmament and the Berlin crisis. White House press secretary Pierre Salinger said McCloy, the president's chief adviser on disarmament, would be accompanied to the White House by Secretary of State Dean Rusk. Their appointment is for 6 p.m. EDT. McCloy completed an urgent flight from Moscow to Washington last night in response to a summons from Kennedy. He brought an informal personal message from the Soviet leader to the U.S. chief executive. In advance of his meeting with Kennedy, McCloy was scheduled to give Rusk a detailed report on his conversations with Khrushchev. McCloy already has sent a long cable giving Kennedy a preliminary report on his talks with Khrushchev at the Soviet premier's Black Sea vacation villa. This report was forwarded to Kennedy over the weekend at his Hyannis Port, Mass., vacation home. Salinger declined to give any hint of the tenor of Khrushchev's talks with McCloy. Mongolia Bar Also Talk Item

Washington, July 31 (AP)—President Kennedy today opened consultations with Chinese Nationalist Vice President Chen Cheng designed to shape policy in opposing the seating of Communist China in the United Nations. The White House meeting was immediately after the arrival of the Chinese official for a 3-day visit. Kennedy was joined by Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson, Secretary of State Dean Rusk and State Department experts on the United Nations and Far Eastern affairs. Chen was accompanied by his Foreign Minister Chen Chang, Huan and by the permanent Chinese Nationalist representative at the U.N., Dr. T. F. Tsiang. Another subject for discussion was the question of U.S. recognition of Outer Mongolia, which has caused great anxiety in Taipei. Chen was given a red carpet reception at the airport. Vice President Johnson, who headed the welcoming group of dignitaries, told him: "The President has asked me to say that he is looking forward to meeting with you. He anticipates having highly useful exchanges (Continued on Page Three)

Reserve Callup Bill Approved

Washington, July 31 (AP)—Congress today gave President Kennedy full authority to put one-quarter of a million reservists into uniform and add 12-months to military enlistments and active duty. The House voted overwhelming approval of the emergency resolution, previously passed by the Senate. This sent it to the White House six days after the President called for an immediate defense buildup to deter or win any fight for Berlin and to meet Communist threats elsewhere in the world. The resolution specifically empowers the President to call on active duty for one-year up to 250,000 Ready Reservists as individuals or in units. It also authorizes extended training periods for all of the 2,440,000 members of the ready reserve.

Reds Have Socialism, Far from Communism

By JAMES MARLOW (Associated Press News Analyst) Washington, July 31 (AP)—Real communism for the Russians is still a long way off. They try to make it look otherwise. It won't stick. In the 44 years since the revolution they had socialism. Communism is still only a dream. Nevertheless, the Russian Communist party over the weekend released its program for the next 20 years. It holds out rich promise of a better and easier life. Some westerners, used to sneering at anything Soviet, are apt to call it pie in the sky stuff. There's no reason to. Since the revolution in 1917 the Communist party in Russia has worked miracles. True, the miracles had bloody foundations: Purges, liquidations, a whole generation of people kept at the grindstone and to a living standard far below this country's. But the progress made is indisputable. Even greater progress can be expected. If some of the program promises are made good they can be expected to affect other areas of the world in one way or another. For instance: The promise of free medicine, free housing. The United States and Russia are in a contest for the minds of men through foreign aid to backward countries. The backward people, anxious to come abreast of the 20th Century, may be more influenced by the progress in their own lands. But the Russian Communist party goes too far when it says in its program: "The present generation of Soviet people shall live under communism. (Continued on Page Two)

Rocket Atom-Subs Missing in Display Of Red Sea Power

By STANLEY JOHNSON Moscow, July 31 (AP)—The Soviet Union put on a show of its sea might yesterday but kept under wraps rocket-firing submarines that Deputy Defense Minister Andrei A. Grechko says are the backbone of the Red Navy. Western observers who watched the naval demonstration off Leningrad said they were not particularly impressed by the display. Grechko, in a speech before taking the salute, boasted "The backbone of the Soviet Navy's might is up-to-date atomic-powered submarines equipped with rockets of various kinds." But none appeared in the parade. Only conventional submarines were seen riding at anchor in the Neva River. About 60 warships, ranging from veteran craft to modern rocket-carrying destroyers and cruisers, took part in the demonstration. A Moscow Radio commentator said the small patrol launches seen racing about were "automatically controlled" and equipped with rockets. But observers noted that each launch carried from six to eight crewmen. Jets of the fleet air arm that zoomed overhead were similar to those unveiled earlier this month at the Moscow air show.

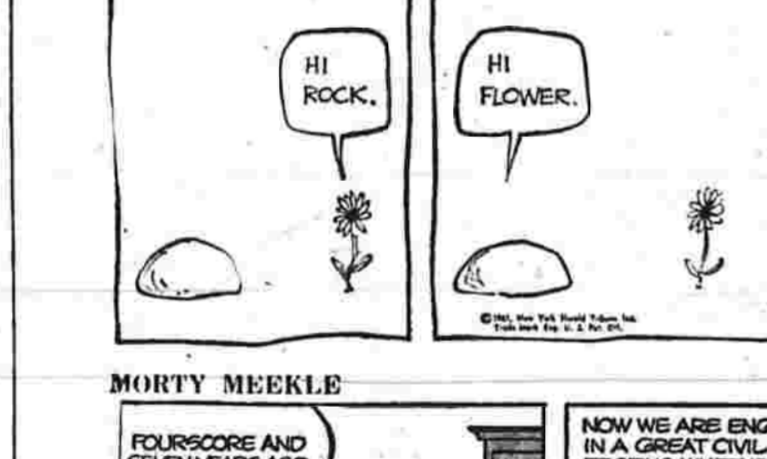
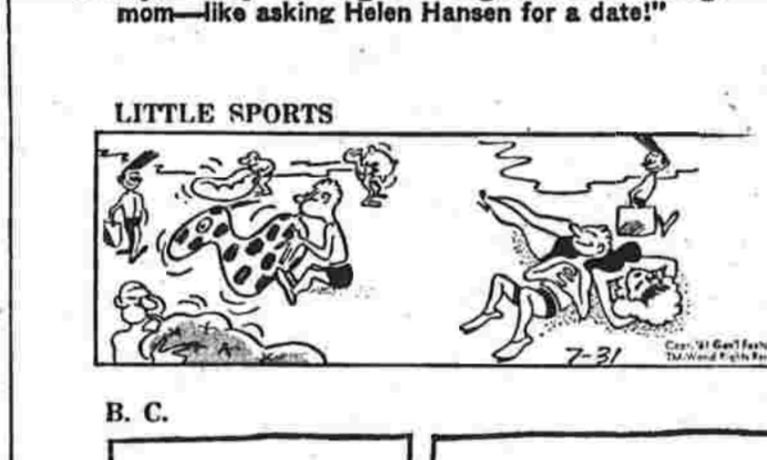
