Meriden, Aug. 5 (AP)—John Davis Lodge said today that the Republican party has a "matchless opportunity" to formulate a program to "counteract the enormous increase in the state debt, in government expenditures and in taxes which we have witnessed during the past few years."

The former Connecticut governor and ex-US ambassador to Spain made the statement in a guest column he wrote for today's edition of the Meriden Journal. Lodge said important industrial concerns "are moving out of the state in search of more advanced locations. A determined effort must be made to retain and attract business and industry, to diminish unemployment and to increase take-home pay by tax adjustments and by tax reductions."

On the critical Budget conference the Democrats have "many fine people" but that "unfortunately many of them have failed to recognize the party's position."

The challenge to the Republican party is to demonstrate that it will follow a series of steps to reduce the state debt, to reduce the state's budget deficit, to reduce the state's unemployment rate, and to reduce the state's tax burden.

Housing Unit Reviews Westhill Applications

Letters and questionnaires will be mailed next week to all who have filed preliminary applications for apartments in the Westhill Housing for the Elderly development on W. Center St.

Interviews with applicants will begin Aug. 21 in a temporary office of the Manchester Housing Authority at the East Side Recreation Center, School St. The letters explain that the Housing Authority is required by law to verify the income of all members of a family applying for admission to the apartment project, and informs applicants what documentary evidence is to be furnished at the time of interviews. Occupancy in the project is restricted to low-income families, whose total income does not exceed \$3,600 a year, or individuals, and rents will be based on the total amount of income. A schedule of rental costs will be announced soon upon advice of the New York regional office of the federal housing authority. The project, expected to be completed for occupancy early in 1962, will include efficiency one-bedroom and two-bedroom units. All units will be equipped with ranges and refrigerators, and rentals will include heat, light and water, all utilities except telephone. Letters to those who have filed preliminary applications designate dates and time for interviews. Applicants must bring to the interview evidence of social security awards, evidence of pension payments, employment and earning records, income tax return for 1960 if filed, and other evidence of income including stocks, bonds, bank accounts, financial assistance from relatives, town, state or federal government, and annuities. Two women will staff the temporary office as part-time employees for interviews and processing of applications. The questionnaire asks for listing of the applicants and all who will live with them, including age, date and place of birth and occupation if any; information on assessed value, mortgage, monthly payments and balance due from home owners; monthly rent payments; monthly payments if applicants live with relatives; payments for utilities; years of residence in Manchester, military service of family members; data on income and total assets; present housing data, and preference of type of unit in the new development.

Success Just Seemed To Happen to Dorothy

When the arrangements were being made for an interview with Dorothy Collins for this article, the picture kept recurring in our mind of the pretty young girl next door with the white blouse and black tie who made famous—and in turn became famous as a result of it—the cigarette commercial on "Your Hit Parade" in the early years of television.

It has been a long road and a most successful one since the "Be Happy, Go Lucky" jingle became her trademark and the association paved her way to success.

Actually, Dorothy hasn't changed a bit. She is still as lovely and charming as the white blouse and tie are gone, and she is now the mother of two lovely girls, Deborah, 6, and Elizabeth, 2.

Although the question uppermost in our mind was how she, who has been primarily a singer, became a regular on "Candid Camera" (CBS-TV, Sundays, 10 to 10:30, we were soon to learn that Dorothy has exhibited a versatility perhaps little known to most TV fans.

In her early years as a vocalist with the "Raymond Scott Quintet," the petite songstress was called upon to act as mistress-of-ceremonies as well as a vocalist while Raymond Scott, who chartered her career and married her in 1952, left to take over as conductor of "The Hit Parade" orchestra for his brother, Mark, after his death.

In 1950 Scott was asked by a national tobacco company to create a "jingle" commercial for one of their products. Dorothy, without credit, sang the verse. The success of the commercial eventually led to her being signed for "Your Hit Parade." This, in turn, led to national recognition. She starred on the program during its lengthy television run.

By late 1956 she began branching out as a major attraction at leading night clubs and hotels around the nation. During the last few years she has also been seen frequently as a guest star on the

top variety shows, including "The Garry Moore Show," "The Pat Boone Show," "The Perry Como Show" and "Music for a Summer Night." She has also starred on "South Pacific," "Carousel" and "Rosalia."

Thus, we come back to our question of Dorothy and "Candid Camera." It seems that when plans were made to revive "Candid Camera," Allen Funt decided he didn't want anyone with any set routines. "I want someone like Dorothy Collins," he said. Dorothy agreed to appear as a semi-regular and participate in various candid film vignettes. And it was as simple as that.

The success of "Candid Camera" has been phenomenal. It beat out its opposition, "The Loretta Young Show," in the ratings—a feat no other show has been able to accomplish. We feel Dorothy Collins has been a strong cog in the wheel of success of "Candid Camera."

Viewers will long remember Miss Collins driving a car without any motor; asking passersby to change a tire while her husband naps in the back seat of the car; asking people at Idlewild Airport to look after her "little sister" who is making her first flight alone; smoking a cigar and assaying the reaction of the man-in-the-street to lady cigar smokers—and many more hilarious sequences.

What plans for the future has blonde, blue-eyed Dorothy? She frankly admit that she has none as far as show business is concerned, and that from the very start, she was never too ambitious. All her many successes "just seemed to happen," she says.

Dorothy was born in Windsor, Ont., Canada, on Nov. 18, 1926. She recalls that an early childhood ambition was to follow in the footsteps of a favorite aunt and become a first-rate secretary. This changed, however, when her parents entered her in a local amateur songfest. She won first prize and, as a result, became a regular on a children's radio show originating in neighboring Detroit. After her school days, Dorothy was visiting friends in Chicago, and it was then that bandleader Raymond Scott happened to hear her sing. The rest is Collins history.

Reggie Once Weather Girl

Almost every night for two chilly winter months, a strange phenomenon occurred in Chicago. At exactly 11:10 p.m., regardless of how cold Lake Michigan caused the Windy City to be, male temperatures rose to near fever pitch. The cause (not accepted by scientists) was a spectacularly beautiful blonde who reported the weather forecast over a local TV station.

Although Reggie Dombeck doesn't give weather reports anymore, she still is raising temperatures via TV—as hostess for ABC-TV's daily daytime game show, "Number Please" (Monday through Friday, 12:30-1:00 p.m. NYT).

Slender and curvaceous Reggie is responsible for displaying the prizes won by "Number Please" contestants. And, on occasion, she is asked by the producer to participate in some skits.

"You don't know how nice it is being able to settle down and get to know the people you work with," Reggie says, "until you've worked as a model for a while. You see, modeling took me all over the world. I've been to the Far East, Hawaii, the Caribbean and all over Europe. Oh, yes, Korea, too. I was mistress of ceremonies at a USO show there called 'GI's and Dolls.'"

"The only thing wrong with that kind of life is that I was unable to stay in one place long enough to really get to know anyone. That's why I'm so thrilled to be working on 'Number Please'—at the same studio, with the same people every day. Believe me, it's great."

"Number Please" is Reggie's first regular TV show since her short weather girl stint almost six years ago.

"I'm not as old as it may seem," she quickly explained, "it's just that I've been modeling on TV since I was 16."

Miss America Finalist

For the record, the green-eyed blonde is 24 years old, 5 feet 8 and 1/2 pounds. She's been modeling ever since being named Miss Furniture in 1953 and she's still had time to graduate from Northwestern University, where she majored in psychology. Reggie also was one of the finalists in the 1955 Miss America contest.

With all her experience as a model, however, Reggie's career was almost completed before it hardly had started.

"I was modeling a mink coat in an exclusive hotel in Chicago," she said, "and I had to walk down a long flight of stairs. On the second step, I felt myself starting to topple. To this day, I still can't figure out how I managed to keep myself from falling on my rump. I was so embarrassed I could have died."

Her first assignment as hostess on "Number Please," by the way, was to model a mink coat. "At least I passed my first test with flying colors," she grinned, "I didn't even feel like falling."
