

Defends His Play

When the hand was over, West defended his play. It would be correct, he pointed out, if East had led from J-9-x-x of spades with the ace of clubs or diamonds with the ace of clubs or diamonds as an entry. West would presumably get in with the king of diamonds to lead another spade, and East would eventually get his side ace and take two spade tricks to defeat the contract.





"We're touching on subjects Perry Mason wouldn't go near," says Brodkin. "Subjects like mixed marriages and mercy killings. We're not worried about a comparison with any other show about lawyers. This is so much better."

It is being shot in New York simply because that's where Brodkin and Rose want to shoot it. They find the artistic climate much better here—"no interfermuch better here—'no interference, no factory techniques, just as many good technicians and more good actors'—so they much prefer their New York base.

Herb Brodkin is one of several producers beginning to get the chance to do what they want to do. The Defenders isn't exactly as Brodkin would wish; he would

prefer to do it alive.
"It's fun as it is," he says, "but it would be more fun live. I'm optimistic about live television

"I definitely feel there will be a renaissance of TV quality. I feel that, because TV is so lousy now, there has to be either a renaissance or a disappearance."

And that's just about the size of it, TV, as it now stands, must fall or improve. And nebody wants it to fall-so, obviously, it'll get

The show itself has developed a personality very much like Bill's. The "surprised" viewer is rewarded for his participation by a phone conversation with the show's emcee and a substantial

The exciting and surprising format of the program, plus the easy-going manner of Bill Leyden, make "It Could Be You" a welcome ad-dition to TV's summer nighttime schedule—no matter how many times it leaps on and off the evening programming.

In any event, whether or not "It Could Be You" continues for years to be television's nighttime relief pitcher, we're certain Bill Leyden will always be in there pitching in whatever he does.
