Ward and Scott, who have the unique distinction of being the only cartoon producers who never worked for Walt Disney, operate their 150-man company from their second-story office in an early California type Spanish bungalow court. Nearby are air-conditioned offices for writers, artists, and editors, while around the corner on Sunset Strip (No. junior, not 77) is the head office with the main staff.

Ward personally works standing up, not at some elbow-high writing deak like a Dickensian lawyer, but using the top of a television console as his deak.


