Another tip from Dehner, which is valuable even if you are not an actor about to die for your art, is on nervousness — or, in his case, stage and/or camera fright.

"I never say to myself, 'I'm nervous.'" he says, "I say, 'I'm excited.' It may be the same feeling, but now it becomes an advantage rather than a disadvantage,"
