About 6,500 U.S. servicemen and their dependents are stationed at Misawa Air Base in northern Japan.

Gen. Niess said U.S. Air Force medical teams are experimenting with drugs to protect humans from radical cell changes that sometimes result from exposure to radiation.

The experiments have developed a "pretty good knowledge" about drugs that eventually might increase by 80 per cent a human's ability to tolerate radiation, the general said.

Dr. Milton G. Savos said they are commonly known as yellow ants. The swarmers are reddish brown with a somewhat bulbous abdomen and are about one-quarter inch long. The workers—non-winged type—are about three-eights of an inch long and light tan in color.

The Extension specialist observed the winged reproductive forms swarm in basements and around house foundations. Often, they are mistaken for termites. This ant may bring large piles of dirt to the ground at the entrance to its nest indoors or outside, and this usually alarms many homeowners. Aside from the debris, no harm is done by this ant, he said. To control these ants, Dr. Savos surgests applying a chloridane dust

To control these ants, Dr. Savos suggests applying a chlordane dust or liquid to the nest opening. Nests can be spotted by mounds of sand along sidewalks, driveways, the foundation outside and along the base of walls and cracks in the cellar floor. If the ants have raised a small mound, scrape it away and treat the opening. Before applying the pesticide, users are advised by Dr. Savos to read the label on the pesticide package carefully for directions and precautions.






