One Drug Is Key to Store Of Spare Parts for Humans

By GABE KADMOWITZ

New York (NEA)—Scientists now may be only one drug away from the opening of a fully stocked store of spare human parts.
The drug is needed to repress the body's natural resistance, in the form of antibodies, toward any foreign substance introduced into the body.
Anti-bodies generally work in the human's favor, resisting infections, allen viruses and the like. They provide the necessary immunity for a host of diseases and aliments, particularly when reinforced by vaccines or other substances which raise the body's level of resistance.
But when surgeons try to replace a diseased kidney, for example, with someone else's good one or graft human skin onto a victim of burns, such immunity works against the human. The body resists the transplant or graft just as it would a harmful substance.
Dr. Robert A. Good of the University of Minnesota medical school believes that this barrier of immunity may be bridged by a drug, thus paving the way for replace mother human body or by a mechanical device.
Such a drug soon may be found. One tested on a dog for more than a year successfully suppressed the animal's natural immunity.
Should a drug be found, adaptable to human needs, Dr. Good says that scientists and surgeons have most of the technical know how to replace hearts, kidneys, lungs, ovaries, etc., with spare human store the technical know how to replace hearts, kidneys, lungs, ovaries, etc., with spare human parts or mechanical contraptions.






