ignorance or even a phobia to play Santa Claus that is causing such big electric current users as the town and the hospital, but also all other businesses and every home purchaser of electricity to sit back and ignore the now proven fact that the light com-pany is and has been engaging in legalized larceny?

The public utilities commission tells me that it can direct a utility to do a specific thing only after a formal hearing. At the start of a public hearing on electric light rates in all of the territory controlled by the Hartford Electric Light Company the head of that company said under oath, referring to the elec-tric light rates in Manchester and Bolton—"This, of course, is a situation which could not continue indefinitely." And months ago the public utilities commission told me it was their hope that the unquestionable overcharge for current in Manchester and Bolton, would soon be adjudicated.

I have been and still am considering asking the courts for an injunction enjoining the light company from cutting off my current if I refuse to pay any more electric light bills which according to the head of the light company are a "steal" in any language you use, until the rate is corrected. The utility commission is required by law to make its finding in 120 days. Meantime, as in the past four or five years, every user of electricity in Manchester and Bolton is being gyped and I use that word advisedly.

If your grocer, garage or any other store with which you did business boldly admitted to you that you were being overcharged you would take your business elsewhere. But, in the matter of utilities you cannot do that because the state has given them a monopoly.

I challenge any town official, any trustee of the hospital, any businessman, any householder to give me one reason why this indefensible situation is allowed to continue particularly when no one dares deny that it is costing the town and its inhabitants thousands of dollars a month.

At the start of my fight for a correction of the rates many people thought I was a bit daffed. But, as with the tolls on the bridges and the direction of 6 corporations of which I have been president I knew what I was doing. No, I don't need a psychlatrist but many of the so-called political and business wizards need much more than psychiatry. They need a shot of that new serum which is supposed to develop intestinal fortitude. There is another word for it but I dislike being indelicate despite the-great temptation.

And now that I am opining on public matters I want to thank Father Hannon for his urge that we join him in praying for the recovery of my long time friend "Dick" Martin. And next, I want to stress that the many boards of directors who for years have never developed and trained a runner-up man in case Town Manager Martin became incapacitated couldn't get even a second look in any big business in the world. Our present status in town is a disgrace. Even former President Elsenhower only Thursday night on TV said the president should have an executive assistant. At the moment I consider Mayor Turkington the best fitted to take over.
