Tedesco of Bridgeport. Oslo, Norway, Oct. 23 (P)— The Nobel peace prize for 1961 was swarded today to Dag Hammarskjold, who per-ished on a peace mission in The Congo. The delayed peace prize for 1960 went to Albert John Luthuli, a Zulu Christian leader in South Africa, for his efforts to alleviate racial discrimination. Luthuli is racial discrimination. Luthuli is

the first African to receive the prize, worth 250,232 kroner (\$48,-640). The Nobel Peace Prize Com-mittee of the Norwegian Storting (parliament) last year postponed The prize committee's statement gave no specific reason for Hammarskjold's award. The prize will be placed at the disposal of Hammarskjold's estate. its award.

Adlai Stevenson had joined oth-ers in urging the prize be award-ed to Hammarskjold posthumous-ly. In view of the early closing Hammarskjold became the first man to receive the prize posthu-mously. The U.N. Secretary-gen-eral was killed Sept. 18 when his plane crashed on route to Ndola, Northern Rhodesia. He was seek-ing to end the fighting between Katangan and U.N. forces by negotiating with President Molse Tahombe of Katanga Province. This is the third time a peace prize has gone to the United Na-tions, U.N. Undersecretary Ralph J. Buncha of the United States won the prize in 1950. The U.N. Adial Stevenson had joined oth-ers in urging the prize be award-ed to Hammarskjold posthumous-ity. In view of the early closing date for nominations. Explosion Recorded By Swedes, Japanese

Oslo, Norway, Oct. 23 (AP)-News that the Russians had exploded a superbomb reached parliament today as members debated a resolution protesting Soviet atmospheric tests. The report touched off angry reaction.

Several members demanded a delay in a vote on the resolution so it could be revised in stronger language. Other members, however, insisted any delay in a vote might be considered a sign of wavering, and the resolution was adopted unanimously.

The Soviet Union set off a giant nuclear explosion today. A Swedish expert said there is reason to believe the bomb was at or near the 50-megaton range promised by Premier Khrushchev. A spokesman for the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission suggested caution in speculating about the explosion until more information becomes available.

The observatory at Uppsala, Sweden, said today's explosion was twice as heavy as any record-ed for previous Soviet tests in the series that began last month. The explosion also was record-On Target for ed in France and Japan. Japan's Central Meteorological Agency said the Soviet blast ap-peared to be of a promised 50legaton bomb.






