The two tests, one in the atmosphere and one under the sea, were made yesterday in the vicinity of the Arctic island of Novaya Zemlya. If such proves to be the case, it may be assumed that the test of a 50-megaton device mentioned by Nikita Khrushchev last week is still to come. The Soviet premier told the 22nd Communist party congress this test would be held at the Washington, Oct. 24 (P)—The Soviet Union is getting a backfire of radioactive fallout today from its mammoth nuclear explosion, U.S. Weather Bureau scientists reported. They said the fallout was carried on winds blowing south

to southeast over Russia. to southeast over Russia.

The massive blast, triggered yesterday in the atmosphere over the Novaya Zemlya region in the Arctic, may have been the 50-megaton explosion that Soviet Premier Khrushchev amounced the Russians would test. But the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission said it doubts that the detonation was that big.

The AEC said the blast's yield "was very high, possibly as high as 50 megatons." But it added that preliminary analysis "indicates it was more probably on the order of 20 megatons."
