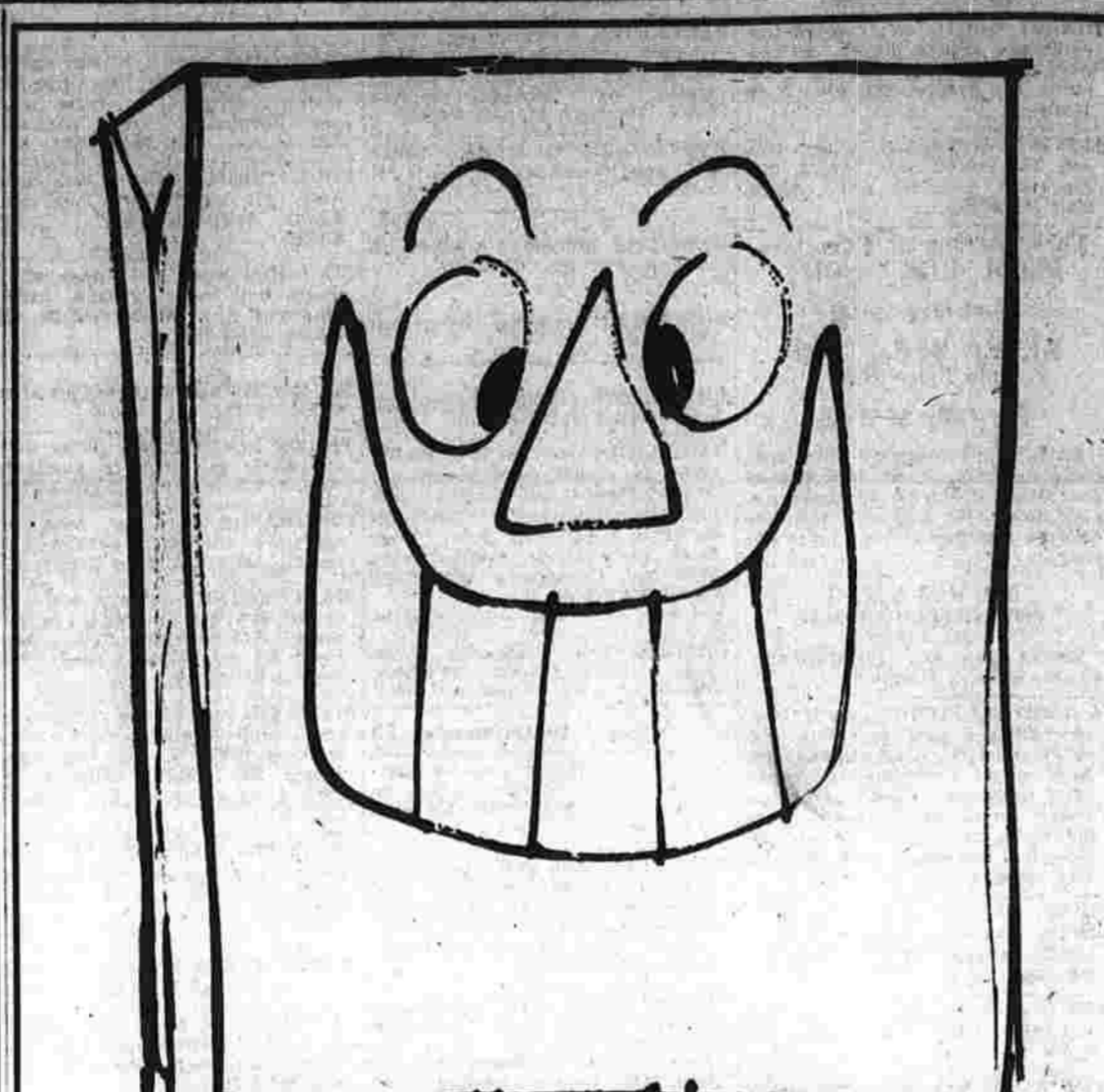

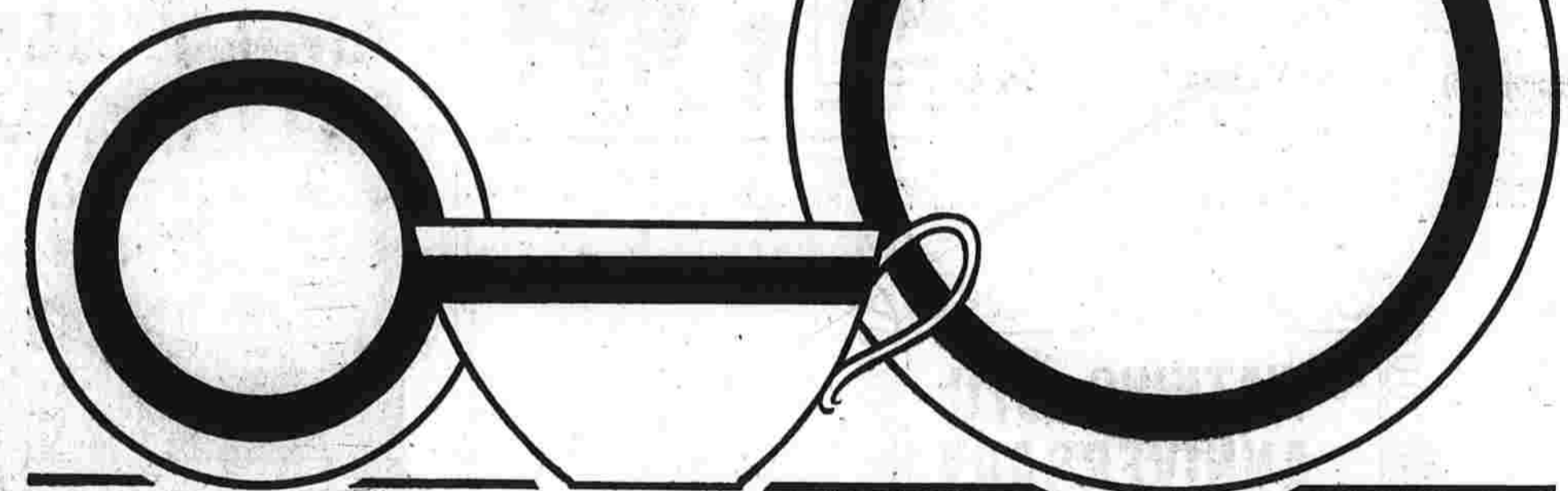

(Continued from Page One) resolution Wednesday by a vote of 75-16, but only after a stormy overtime session in which a parade of Communist and neutral delegates fought it every step of the way.

The assembly vote was expected to be still stronger than that in the committee. Nigeria and El Salvador, two of the members absent during the committee ballot, indicated they would cast yes votes today.

Soviet Delegate Semyon K. Tsarupkin has made plain the Kremlin would reject the appeal. He told the committee that numerous by the NATO nations would prevent the Soviet Union from perfecting its defenses.

The political committee continued its work today with the United States accusing India of trying to join the same boat with the Soviet Union as far as violation of the moratorium on nuclear tests was concerned.

U.S. Delegate Arthur Dean asserted that India's attitude sounded much like that of Khrushchev who has declared that American actions in Berlin forced Russia to testing to build up its defenses.

The Indian delegation has a perfect right to take this attitude if it so wishes," Dean declared. "It is the right to equate made earlier by Indian delegates.

U.S. Delegate told the U. N. Correspondence Association. He added, however, that he would do this only after getting the endorsement of a similar group with which he has been working on the problem of setting up a secretariat.

A British source said Britain is pending to fight any General Assembly move to impose a worldwide political and economic boycott on South Africa for its refusal to abandon white supremacy.

Who Says There Isn't A Santa Claus?

Albuquerque, N. M., Oct. 27 (AP)—Sen. Hugh Scott, R-Pa., predicted last night that Communist China will be admitted to the United Nations.

"I think it was cowardly for the United States to abstain on the vote on admission of Outer Mongolia to the United Nations. That is (Soviet Premier) Khrushchev's oldest ally, and not even recognized by the American government."

"I think the purpose was to prepare the way for the recognition of Red China," Scott said. "Red China will either be admitted to the U. N. after the 1962 election."
