As one of the hig names he modestly didn't list, Arien was on the same Hollywood gravy train named "Inspiration."

"When my 'salary was the biggest," Aries laughed it up to us, "my golt handicap was the lowest. Why, sometimes I played 56 ho'es a day. I don't believe being 30 years younger had anything 30 de with the big number of standards all of us wrote in those days.


