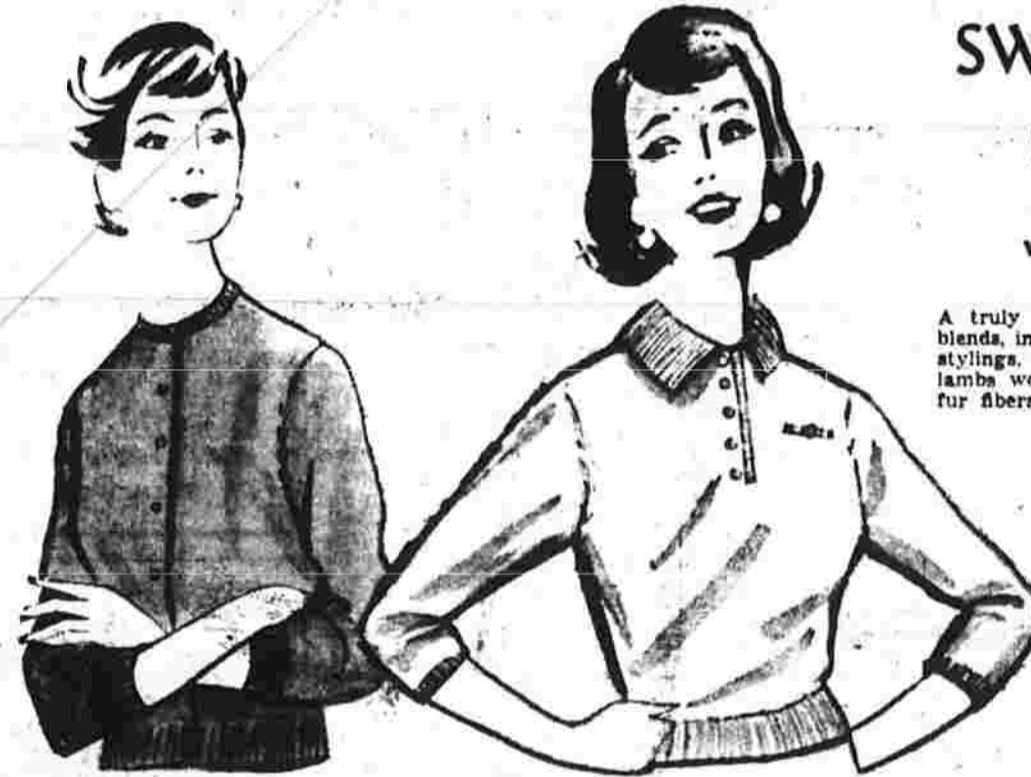

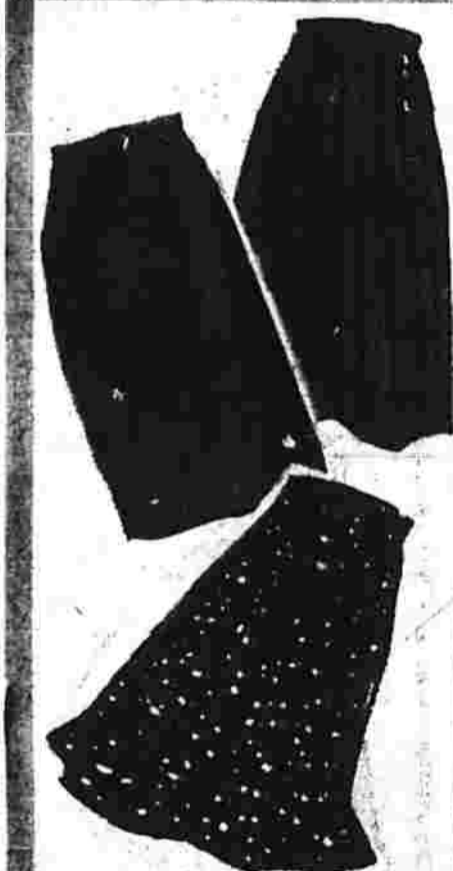

Nike-Zeus Passes Test
Point Mugu, Calif., Nov. 22 (AP)—A Nike-Zeus missile killer circled high over the Pacific yesterday in its second successful test in six days.

The test, second success in a row, was hailed jubilantly by Army officers laboring to speed up development of a defense against missile attacks.

One hundred per cent successful—all goals were achieved, a spokesman said.

The 48-foot solid-fuel anti-missile rocket was destroyed far down-range to avoid endangering ships.

Yesterday's test of the first two stages was expected to bring closer the day when a complete 3-stage Nike-Zeus will be fired.

Early next year the Army will begin firing Nike-Zeus rockets from Kauai, Island of Atlas missile launchers from California.

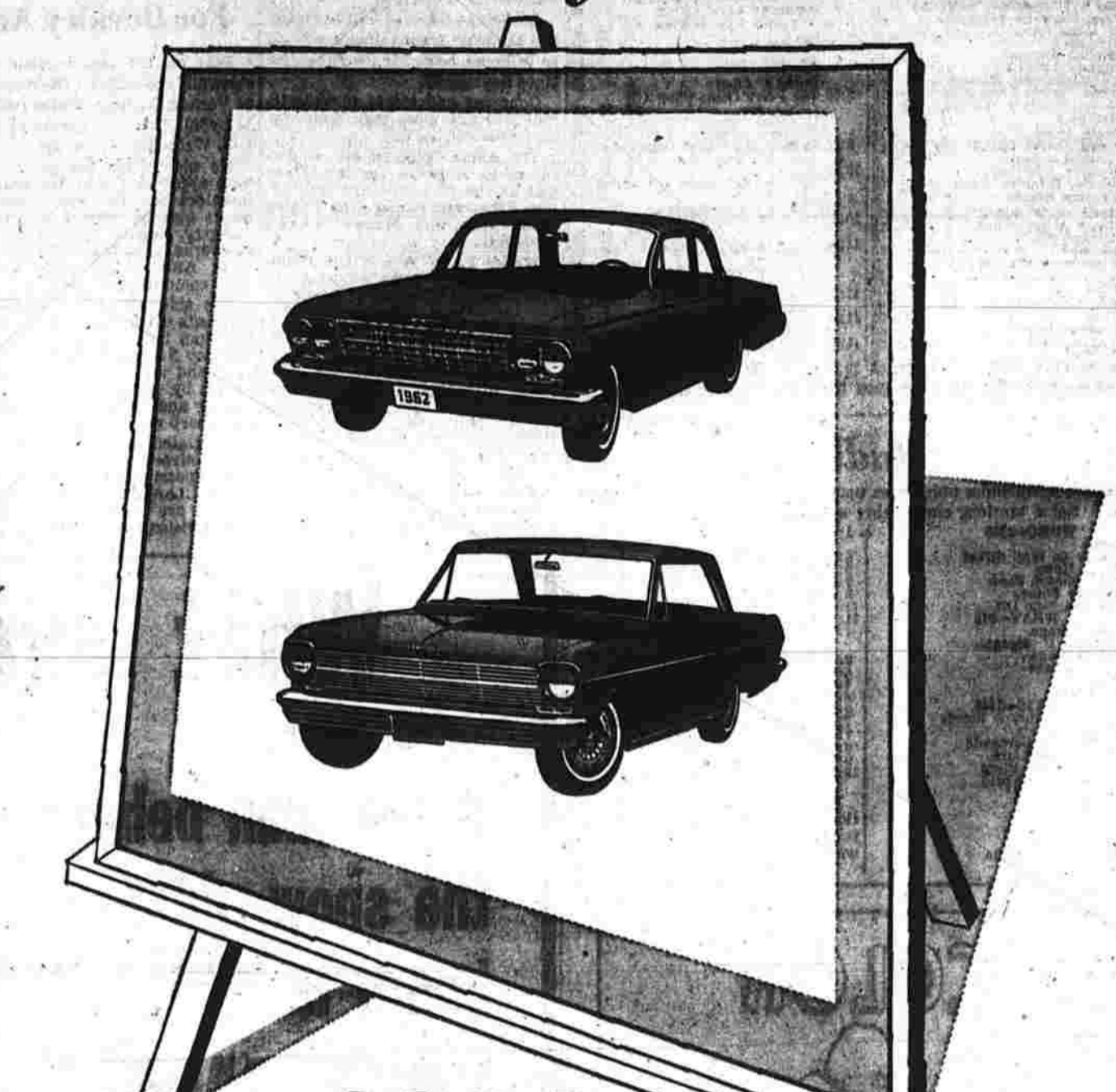
