Nike-Zeus Passes Test

Point Mugu, Calif., Nov. 22 (#)

—A Nike-Zeus missile killer streaked high over the Pacific yesterday in its second successful test in six days.

The test, second success in a row, was hailed jubilantly by Army officers laboring to speed up development of a defense against missile attack.

"One hundred per cent successful—all goals were achieved, a spokesman said.
