

Bailey Gives Mailing Tips

With Christmas a little more than a month away, Postmaster Alden Bailey, urging adoption of a "do it now" policy for early mailings, has offered numerous public aids on how to get mail to its destination quickly and safely.

Postmaster Bailey offered three general guides so that disappoint-ment on Christmas Day can be avoided: (1) wrap gifts securely, (2) address them clearly and cor rectly, and (3) mail both cards and gifts early.

be sent out by Dec. 10, and Christmas packages for local delivery should be mailed not later than Dec. 15, Bailey said. He asked business firms, to delay mailing circulars and catalogs until after
