Doctor Says

Q-Would you write about osteoorosis? What is it? Is it serious? Can anything be done to cure it? have just gotten an X-ray report that says I have osteoporosis of my bones. I am 52 years old and had the "change" four years ago. A—Osteoporosis is a disturbance in which the bons structure ap-pears faintly outlined due to loss of calcium (lime). Under ordinary circumstances it is the calcium salt that holds us that holds up passage of the X-ray and thus produces the shadow that is seen on the film. The condition is not serious in itself although it may be an indication of the presence of a serious underlying dis same. It is not related to the meno pause although it is most often observed in middle or later life.

Treatment of osteoporosis depends on its basic cause. If it is due wholly to an insufficient dietary intake of calcium, it is easily corrected by concentrating on will corrected by concentrating on milk, cream, butter and cheese.

If it is due to excess loss of calcium through the intestines as in diarrheal diseases, dietary treat-ment must be supplemented by measures directed toward control of the bowles.

Q—I understand that there are special Cancer Detection Clinics in New York and other large cities. How do you arrange to be examined at these clinics? And how often should a middle-aged couple visit these clinics?

A-The Strang Cancer Prevention Clinic is connected with the Memorial Hospital for Cancer and Allied Diseases at 419 East 67 Street in New York City, to which equests for appointments may be addressed.

Let the Buyer Beware When Borrowing Money A great many things are being said in Washington after the Senate Banking Subcommittee's wind-Are we really happy with credit? This is what I asked Mark T. Walsh, assistant attorney gen-

eral in charge of consumer rackets in the office of New York's attorney general.

Walsh traced the importance of credit to the economy, citing the benefits of credit when not used to excess. Then he said: "Consumers are in a rebellious mood though perhaps they are not completely aware of it. The num-ber of new books, now high on best seller lists, is proof of this. So is the fact that now that the recession is over, the use of credit is not going up. Relative to savings, in recent years, we have not What we rebel against, he says, is not so much the price tag or quality of the product or service we buy as dollars we lose and complexities we face on financing charges. He says that often we are good bargain hunters when it comes to shopping a product or service, but he deplores our lack of care and knowledge when it comes to shopping for credit.

An installment sales contract, he continued, looks like a bill of ding and not even the most liter ate of us is able to understand in terms of dollars and cents how much we are paying.

I think Walsh makes a fine point

when he cites that our average family savings today amount to some \$1,100 and yet it is these very families that use credit the most extensively. He points that most of us spend \$50 to finance a 250 purchase.

If instead, you borrowed the \$250 from your savings account, pledging your pass book or split-ting the account, the rate would be less than 3 per cent and the actual cost to you \$7.

It will not be easy to standize credit charges. Too many variables are involved. Some persons are better credit risks than others. and those who are poorer risks should be charged more.

Some credit charges include various types of insurance, different services; other credit charges include less of those ingredients. A Manchester woman who was a supervisor in the Hartord Hospital housekeeping department died yesterday in the ninth floor fire which killed 15.

She was Miss Grace O. Hatch, 60, of 31 Green Rd., an employe of the hospital for 15 years. Miss Hatch was among three hospital personnel and a private duty nurse who perished with six patients and five visitors in flames and smoke on the hospital's ninth floor

Hartford Fire Chief Thomas Lee said that the only thing that had been established was that the fire started in the trash chute between the first and third floors. The chute fire touched off an explosion of undetermined source which rocked the floor, blasting billows of thick black

smoke through the eighth and minth floors. More than 100 persons were apped in hospital rooms as the fire transformed once gleaming orridors into a mass of charred Patients broke windows in their

## Report on Kennedy

It's been more than a year since John F. Kennedy's election, and nearly 11 months since

How well has he measured up to the daring, imaginative aims he set for himself in seeking the presidency? To what extent has Kennedy the President, caught up with Kennedy, the campaigner?

To get the answers, and the material on which an objective appraisal could be based AP newsfeatures writer Arthur Edson talked to scores of people who are in a position to judge —to praise or to condemn.
