Here's Device to Make Push Buttons Obsolete

By JERRY SHEERMAN

New York—(NEA)—Engineer William Derach told the listeners that he had to speak more quietly. He had finished describing the history of his pet project, an adding machine that responds to spoken words, not fingers.

The machine is accustomed to my speaking to it at a certain volume," he explained. With that, he flipped a switch, and his shoeboxed invention—called Shoobox—was ready to operate. It was attached by wires to an adding machine.

Deliberately Derach said "oh-oh-oh" for zero. From inside Shoobox came a modest "click," followed almost simultaneously by a click of the adding machine as it printed the zero.

"One," said Derach.

"Click click," responded the machinery on the table.

"Click click."

Derach continued counting to "nine." Likewise, in a neat line of printed digits, did the adding machine.

"The first little sound each time counts the number of digits, by guessing the number," Derach explained patiently.

"You may notice that the machine is still on, but it ignores everything else I say, as well as traffic and room sounds."

The series knowledge that the machine—built for IBM's Advanced Systems Development Division—was just sitting there, unused, caused a definite hush to grip the room.

From 10 feet away a photographer wound his movie camera with a sharp "click" sound. In response to what he thought was one of his words.

"They like each other," someone muttered.

Derach assured the onlookers that the magic relay was presently made "click" sound. But it had immediately discovered that the camera noise was not a real word and had blocked the impulse to its adding mechanism. The reason the second "click" never came.

Shoobox has also been wired to recognize simple command words. The machine is alert for certain combinations of vowels or other sounds.

"Shoobox doesn't really listen for words," Derach said. "It listens for the structure of the words."

"Think of sound as though it was a road packed with cars. From the air, the traffic ripples, surges and expands. We don't care — so to speak — about the cars arriving at their destination. We measure the wave pattern of the traffic."

Future refinements of Shoobox could find service in such jobs as store inventory work, where hands must be kept free. They might be used in airplanes, where pilots could read navigational figures in-

Wonders of the Universe Water on the Moon: A Vital Space Need

The startling claim that water may exist on the moon either as ice trapped in surface pools or as a thin atmosphere of water vapor has been the subject of a recent article in the popular magazine, "Life".

More than 350 years ago Galileo, looking at the moon through his crude telescope, saw large dark areas which he called "Mare," a Latin word meaning seas. Today's scientists, from observational and theoretical considerations, conclude that the moon is a certain mature, spherical body. They think it is the uniqueness of the moon that makes it so interesting to us. It is the only celestial body in our solar system that is not a gas giant. Using this ratio on the moon, Dr. Kopal finds that it would be covered with a layer of water 1,000 feet deep! This is the quantity of water on the moon should be quite large. If this is in the form of ice it could last 40 million years. Since it could not escape, we are forced to conclude there is a vast volume of water and ice on the moon.

If there is free water on the moon it means that lunar explorers will possess one of the most important elements for the preservation of their lives and the perpetuation of their settlement. No substance would be more important to them than water.

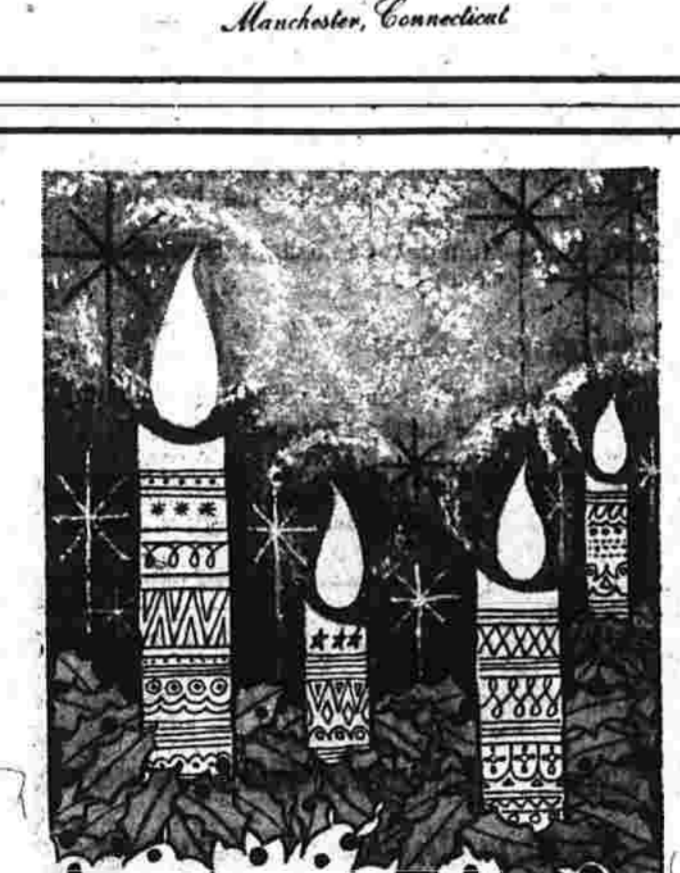

Seeking Out Subs With Fast Robots

Washington — (INRA) — A private company has come up with plans for a fantastic craft that some U.S. Navy men think might be the start of an answer to the Navy's perplexing anti-submarine warfare problem.

The problem: The new generation of Soviet submarines are speedy and silent, hard to find and catch with conventional warships. The proposal: A jet, mass-produced unmanned radio-guided craft that would fly around in packs on the surface of the seas at twice the speed of PT boats. They would be loaded with electronic gear to search for enemy subs. They could be fitted with one torpedo each. The proposed tiny hydrofoil craft, only 22 feet long, will look like something a boy might build with a giant metal construction set. It is designed to ride on an air cushion. This skimmer would depart from a mother ship and land troops well up on the beach, or perhaps inland behind the beach. Hydrofoils might also be useful as high-speed patrol boats. The craft's speed, 50 knots cruising, could be boosted to 90 knots. The spray craft, weighing about 4,000 to 6,000 pounds, would have no crew. It would be guided by radio and would report automatically by radio on any submarines it found. It could be ordered to fire its torpedoes at any time. The craft is so small and so simple that it could be mass-produced quickly without costly equipment for about \$20,000 each. But each craft would then probably have to be loaded with \$100,000 in electronics gear.

A team of four such craft might be assigned to skimming over the sea in search patterns looking for subs. These might carry no weapons. Once an enemy sub was sighted, an armed craft might be sent out on the attack.

There are other hydrofoils still more advanced. A submarine chaser hydrofoil is due for delivery to the Navy late in 1962. It is 117-foot craft, is scheduled to speed something over 40 knots. It may be used for anti-sub patrols in harbors and coastal waters. The Navy planners have still other ideas on the drawing boards, and all of which may prove out in practice.

Another section is devoted to planning and renewal.

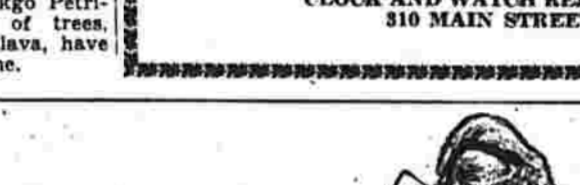

Christmas cards began when?
There is a Christmas card in the British Museum believed printed in 1422.

The first commercial card, were believed to have been done by W. C. Dobson (1840) and Sir Henry Cole (1843), the latter, a small card lithographed and colored by hand.

The English printing house of Goodall & Son, forecasting a fair market, produced Christmas cards in 1848, among them being Little Red Riding Hood, a hermit and snow scenes.

Luigi Prang, a German immigrant introduced commercial Christmas cards in the United States in 1875.

This year's sales of cards will go over the three billion mark and bring the card making industry more than \$600 million, McCraw-Hill Publishing Company's Economic Department says.

Of 300 U.S. firms, five stand out as leaders in the field: Hallmark, Neverson, Rust Craft, Gibson and American Christmas.

Although Christmas is a solemn time, studio cards still sprinkle the market.

One example studio card says "It's a jolly little man with a red nose rings your doorbell on Christmas Eve—please let me in!"

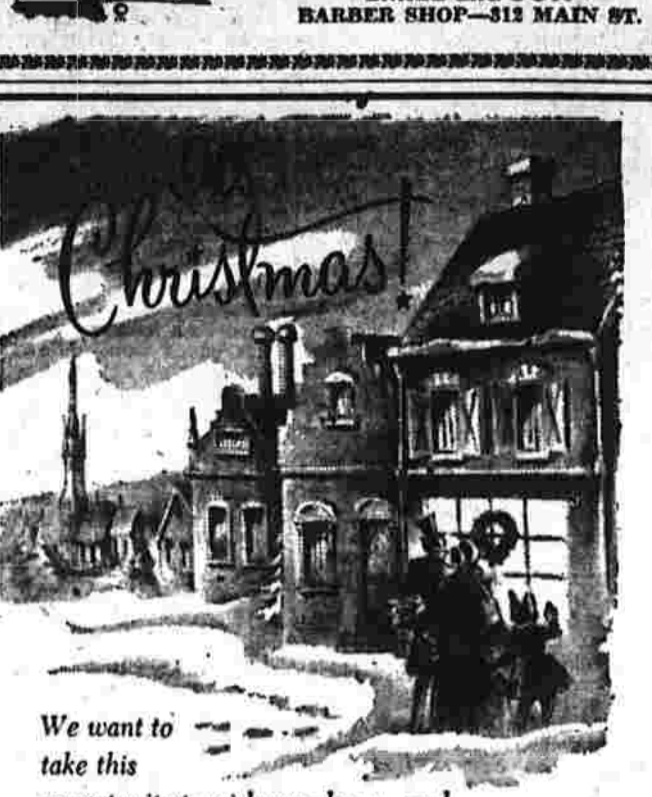

Flash Blaze Kills Man, 45

Waterbury, Dec. 23 (AP)—Frank X. Fox, 45, of 267 Monroe Ave., died early today in a flash fire at his home.

Dr. Harold R. Merrill, acting medical examiner, attributed death to asphyxiation.

Fire Marshal Thomas W. Scadden said Fox apparently was home alone preparing a meal. He theorized that Fox went to the oven and the kitchen caught fire, perhaps from a boil-over.

Scadden said Fox apparently awakened and tried to make his way out of the front entrance of the one-family house. His body was discovered at the entrance by his brother George.

Scadden estimated damage to the house at \$3,000.

Little Girl Burned

Bloomfield, Dec. 23 (AP)—A little girl's burning clothes aided the spread of a fire last night that burned out the interior of her home.

The child, Louise Cahill, 7, was in bed at the time. Her mother, Mrs. Cahill, 33, was in critical condition today at St. Basil Hospital.

The Cahills have 11 children, but two were out at the time of the fire, as was Mrs. Cahill. The youngsters were in the living room when Louise burst into the room from her bedroom, her clothes flaming in an attempt to smother the flames. She had her own clothes to be badly scorched, but escaped serious injury and was taken from the hospital.

Because the basement suffered great damage, Fire Chief William T. Walsh said the fire might well have started there. The cause was unknown.

Fire Hits Yacht Club

Milford, Dec. 23 (AP)—Fire of undetermined origin did extensive damage to the Milford Yacht Club early today.

Milford firemen fought the blaze in the Fort Trumbull section of town for more than an hour before it was brought under control. The first alarm was turned in at 1:30 a.m. and the fire was extinguished at 2 a.m. The last piece of apparatus returned to central fire headquarters at 4:14 a.m.

Nurses Total Drops

Hartford, Dec. 23 (AP)—Registered nurses in active practice in Connecticut numbered 14,128 in 1961, a drop of 130 from last year and 444 from 1960.

This was disclosed yesterday in the annual listing of medical personnel prepared by the State Health Department.

The census also listed 4,022 physicians and surgeons, an increase of 29 from 1960, and about 1,765 dentists, an increase of about 100.

Other categories: Licensed practical nurses—2,791, up 180 since 1960. Osteopathic physicians—56, down from 1960. Podiatrists—180, down 2 from 1960. Naturopaths—58, down one from 1960.
