\$5.000 Added To Funds for Storm Drain

The \$5,000 additional appropria-tion needed for the W. Middle Tpke, storm drain project was approved last night unanimously by the board of directors at special meeting.

The appropriation brings to \$155,000 the amount to be spent on the project. Directors appropriated \$150,000 for the project two months ago, but the apparent low bids submit-ted amounted to \$155,000. Public works department o ficials pruned some parts of the installation to reduce the bid t tals, but were only able to reduce the cost to \$151,000, and this amount did not include any allowance for contingency.

\$4,000 for Contingency Four thousand dollars of last night's appropriation will be for contingency, such as an unusual amount of rock, or coping with other utility pipes which force a change in the level of the storn

Whatever money is not used wi be transferred to the general fund. Democratic Director Ted Powell, erring to his party's traditional favoring of bonding for capital im-provements rather than paying for them out of income, said that the project could have been done at less cost two years ago, when it was first proposed. If the storm drain were paid for with bond arain were paid for with bond money, the money spent on inter-est during the two-year period could have prevented the addition-al construction cost, he said. Later in the meeting, Repub-lican Director Robert Gordon said that while Powell's reasoning might be true for the two-year period, the bonds which would be testing would be for many more would be for many more
