More Birds Giving Up Winter Vacations South

Manchester's winter bird population totals 948 inhabitants representing 53 species, according to the Christmas Bird Count sponsored by the National Audubon Society.

The Manchester census was the 13th annual census undertaken by 70 persons Saturday within the 15-mile diameter of the Greater Hartford metropolitan area. The highest count in the entire area was 31 species sighted by bird watchers in Glastonbury.

The 1961 total count for the metropolitan area was 367,111 birds, of which 230,000 were starlings. Leaving a total of 11,111 other species. Birders tallied 75 species this year. The 1960 total was 261,646, of which 220,000 were starlings, leaving a balance of 41,646 birds representing 59 species.
