



Uniform Year Points Listed

William J. Reynolds of the Con-necticut Public Expenditure Coun-cil (CPEC) spoke to a meeting sponsored by the Bolton Prop-erty Owners Association (BPOA) last night about the advantages of changing to a uniform fiscal year. Reynolds said the topic was not a new one for Bolton since his pre-decessor, Hubert Stone, came to Bolton in 1954 to talk about it. Reynolds told the BPOA t Reynolds told the BPOA that its own way of financing the change and if they, the BPOA study it and decide they have a workable plan they should meet with selectmen and the board of finance to talk it over. If the BPOA firmly believes in the advantages to the town of adopting the uniform fiscal year they should try to sell it to townspeople, Reynolds said.

try to sell it to townspeople, Reynolds said.

The speaker told the group that any citizens association should have broad horizons, not be a negative group, but through self-education develop information to support their position on civic problems.

Reynolds said the information he presented last night was developed from studies made by the CPEC, which is a privately supported fact finding group. He distributed comparative data on Bolton and four Hartford area communities which are of size to which Bolton might grow during the next 10 years.

Of the five towns (Bolton, Avon, East Windsor, Ellington and Suffield) Bolton, although lowest in population in 1960 showed the largest percentage increase, 129.32. Similarly, Bolton had the lowest number of dwellings and building lots among the five towns, but the greatest percentage increases greatest percentage increases-109.38 in dwellings and 425.77 i house and building lots. Reynold used the data to show where Bo

used the data to show where Bolton might stand in the next decade by comparing its present population and expenditures with the towns which had comparable expenditures 10 years ago and relating them to the 1960 figures.

Reynolds told the BPOA that state statutes provide for four ways of making the change to the uniform fiscal year: (1) by accumulating a surplus through an additional levy up to five mills; (2) through a special levy such as two tax bills within one year; (3) borrowing on notes outside the debt limit for up to 20 years and (4) a combination of any of the 3 methods.

Reynolds said it will be increase.

Bushed-Out Earth Although plenty of major politi-cal rumblings occurred on its sur-face during 1961, the Earth last

U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey seismologists told a reporter the year was a "weak" one earthquakewise — with only a few really big temblors occurring, and these at widely separated places on the Earth's surface.

As in other years, there were numerous small quakes. But even so, earthquake activity for the year was happily below average.

Their explanation:

Mother Earth was, in effect, pretty "bushed" after rumbling in real tough fashion the year before — when she loosed such major quakes as the Chilean one

major quakes as the Chilean one that spawned a great tidal wave in the Pacific Ocean. There's plenty of precedent, the

rhere's pienty of precedent, the seismologists say, for such "quiet" years immediately following a year wherein much of the planet's pentup stresses and strains are loosed. For example, 1907, the year following the year of San Francisco's great quake, was a pretty calm one. So were 1924 and 1935, both of which followed big-league earthquake years.

Souped-up Light

Keep the name "LASER" under your hat. Some day, devices bear-ing that monicker may vastly in-crease the range of space commu-nication; make possible "knifeless" surgery; allow transmission of 100 million simultaneous telephone

million simultaneous telephone calls; and even provide a new form of "death ray."

Navy and other scientists say such possibilities are envisioned from still highly experimental research on the "LASER" technique, more formally known as "light amplification by stimulated emission of radiation."

amplineation by stimulated emission of radiation."

"LASER" is a system for amplifying and sharpening weak waves of light to produce a very narrow, powerful beam—and the ultimate hope is to employ optical waves in much the same way radiowaves are now used.

Radioactive Clams

Japanese scientists report finding small amounts of radioactive cerium-144 in samples of food and in animal bone — most especially in clams — and they suspect it comes from nuclear bomb failout. Cerium, a metallic element named for Ceres, the Roman goddess of corn and earth, is the most abundant of the so-called "rare earth" elements.

The scientists pointed out in a report to the technical journal Science, however, that the amounts thye found were "quite trivial" compared with estimated maximum permissible concentrations.

**Hospital Report** 

Shows Net Gain

The annual report of Rockville City Hospital shows the hospital handled 5.215 patients during the period Oct. 1, 1960 to Sept. 30, 1961, and ended the year with a net operating gain of \$1,670.84.

The report was released today by the board of trustees.

Mrs. Virginia J. Yaskulka, superintendent, said the services performed by the hospital are comparable to the services performed the previous year. There were alight increases in some of the categories, she said.

Two hundred and ninety-eight bables were born at Rockville last year, 249 the previous year.

Medical patients numbered 1,661. Patients receiving emergency or out-patient care numbered 3,554. Four hundred and fifty operations were given, and 154 accident victims were given treatment. The average stay per patient was 5.9 days.

Services cost \$634,623.03 over the year, the report said. Patients were charged \$358,600.62, leaving an operating loss of \$76,132.39. But endowment and miscellaneous revenue of \$77,803.23 canceled the loss and left a net gain of \$1,570.84.


