

Harold S: Kramer

The master plan of Manchester he is finishing up won't be com-plete unless townspeople "devote as much study as possible to the work" and "put the comprehensive plan into action," says Harold S. Kramer.

Kramer, a 26-year-old staff planner for Planning and Renewal Associates of Cambridge, Mass., has been working on the study for the past 13 months, and so far has issued seven reports ranging from population growth prospects through 1980 to future land use proposals He arrived in Manchester in November 1960 when his firm was hired by the town at a cost of \$31,000 to investigate Manchester's

actualities versus its potentials.

Completing Work

By the end of next month, he expects to complete three additional reports to fulfill the firm's contract with the town. These include capi-tal improvement needs, proposed tal improvement needs, proposed zoning revisions and a summary report of all nine reports with recommendations for future study. Kramer feels a comprehensive master plan "puts a community on notice it has a responsibility. It's up to them to do the job—it's a very big job, it's an extremely complicated job."

He began his master plan work by doing "homework" to catch up on the town's history and by studying all previous planning studies, he said. Then he looked around town to learn land use and, particularly, the character and nature of developments, said Kramer.

Since this preliminary survey. Kramer has met with political, civic work today, she said.
