





Andover may not be having a population explosion, but the "Estimate of Future Enrollment" recently released by Aram Damarjian, regional 8 superintendent of schools, indicates the school population has been, and will continue to be steadily increasing.

For example, five years ago, the earollment in the elementary school was 237. Five years from now, in the 1966-67 school year, the total enrollment, based on actual birth records, is expected to be \$30. The capacity of the elementary school is 300 students.

Andover residents are certainly not alone in this situation. Figures from this same estimate show ures from this same estimate show that Hebron's elementary school enrollment, 281 in 1956-57, is expected to be 420 in 1966-67. Marl-borough's 232 will go to 591 in the same period, both reflecting a larger increase than Andover's. At RHAM High School, where the current enrollment is 649, a near capacity enrollment is expect-ed in the 1966-67 year with 799 students. Ten years from now, the total predicted enrollment is 1,141, According to Superintenden Damarjian, the estimates are cal

culated from data reported to the State Department of Health, and application of the formula adopted by the State Board of Education Future enrollment figures must also take into account that children of the post-war baby boom will soon be maturing and having bables of their own. Also, the spread of suburban areas has spread of suburban areas has gradually begun to swing farther east from metropolitan Hartford. Newer highways will be speeding commuters longer distances be-tween home and employment. Con-sequently, it is possible that the in-crease noted earlier, will become accelerated and present no easy so lution for future community plan-ners, Damarjain said.
