Stale Blood Use in State

By CHARLES MAHER
Goldstone Tracking Station, Calif., Jan. 27 (R)—The diagnostic properties of the lunar spacecraft, fired toward the Moon yesterday from Florida, was headed instead for open space today but may still get valuable pictures of the lunar surface.

Scientists at this desert tracking station commanded the spacecraft by radio this morning to increase alightly. It is hoped these adjustments will put the Ranger in position to begin photographing the previously—unphotographed left side of the Moon late Sunday morning.

The Ranger is expected to miss the Moon by about 25,000 miles, but project officials say useful photographs may be obtained at this distance.

Had the Ranger sell cross the Moon's Goldstone's illie of sight. This is mandatory because Goldstone is the only tracking station capable of issuing commands to the wayward spacecraft.
