Stale Blood Use in State

May -- Halloween Is Past -- Unmask

The two biggest blunders in the present GOP fight for the gubernatorial nomination are the remarkable arguments of Edwin May Jr., whose campaign is being managed by Representative John Shee, of our town, that if elected governor he will correct the unfair imposition on eastern industrial states of taxes far in excess by any yardstick of similar taxes in the western and southern states. First, governors HAVE ABSOLUTELY NOTHING TO DO with this bewhiskered problem which we have been fighting long before May was born. But as this matter must be settled in congress I now ask May for one documented assertion that he when in congress once opened his mouth on this question, Let's debunk the bunk and cut out trying to fool all of the people all the time. Yes, Shea, wise your babe-in-the-woods candidate up and out of the Robinscon Crusce class. The other blunder of May is that unless a Republican is elected we will have a state income tax in two years. I was fighting against a state income tax long before May flowers were in bloom and rejuctantly I now say that regardless of which major party wins in November we are confronted with but two solutions of our tax delemma. Either slash every part of the state budget to provide but one-a-day school assions, fire a couple of hundred state policemen, cut welfare 75 per cent, in fact even wipe out some state departments or come up with a state income tax. We have been wearing colored glasses too long and the crystal ball but shows a mammoth red light. Now May, I sincerely ask you just what solution do you offer to get the admittedly inequitable tax on the eastern industrial states off our neck and with our state bond issue threateningly near legal limits how do you propose financing state operations? And don't come up with that time-worn claim that you will invoke sufficient state economies to attain this end.
