He hasn't called me intely." There are, Mason feels, two rea-sons why TV has turned its back on this old comedy mainstay. One reason concerns the audience, the other the comic. "There's not much to look at when a stand-up comic is work-ing there on radio, that was all right, but TV sudiences want more action and variety." And the comedian himself finds that it almost endangers his liveli-hood to do too much television. "If a comic uses a routine on TV," Mason says, "he can't use it again for a year. In the old days, it man would have an hour of so of good material. He could use it all be live in wandeville.

man would have an hour of so of good material. He could use it all his life in vaudeville. But, once a man does his rou-tine on TV, he can't do it on a night club floor. He has reached so many people via the home screen that the night club audience won't accept

Bespite all these factors, a co-median such as Mason almost must
 do some television work. As soon as he's seen on TV, his night club-

fees jump. "Last year," Mason says, "per-haps 5 or 10 per cent of my income came from television appearances, But, without it, I would have made much less."
