It was in the day of the trolley that the south end of Main St. was The Terminus. That was the end of the line.

We remember, and perhaps shouldn't mention it, when the Center Gang (upright men who made their informal headquarters at the Center Lunch) used to celebrate Fourth of July 3 through to dawn. Part of the noise of the revelry was due to their foresight in running a rope from Center Church belfry to a convenient tree nearby. The church bells pealed a good part of the night.

Equally rewarding were the sharp reports that resulted every lime a trolley ran up or down the street. The boys kept the tracks well larded with "torpedoes."




