It's been twenty-five years since anyone saw a trolley car in Manchester. But there was quite a to-do in the nation's capital a couple of weeks ago as the street car lines shut down. The last day to ride the trolleys in Washington forced the transit company to put 27 cars in service for the day. It also brought out a real vanguard, a wooden job built in 1918. This was chartered for the day by a group of trolley fans. They draped the front with black crepe and hung a funeral wreath over the headlights.

Now, if there was any such sentimentality when the Connecticut Co. retired its Manchester trolleys, we don't recall it. As a matter of fact, their passing helped a number of people to improve their speech habits.

Most of the tracks at the time ran down the middle of the street. Automobile drivers, caught behind a trolley, had to stop everywhere it did so passengers could alight safely and dash for the sidewalk. In those days of traffic innocence, this was the cause of most cussing that males had been ahead of the trolleys.

Nowadays we know what traffic woe are, and tend to forget the angle of the heyday of the trolley. We remember with nostalgia the old trolleys that were used in the city. A couple of summers ago when Center St. was repaved, the trolleys could not be used. A temporary detour was made on the west side of the street—the wooded side. It was mighty rough in the old Maxwell Chalmers negotiating that bumpy path to the south end of the street.

It was in the day of the trolley that the south end of Main St. was the terminus. That was the end of the line.

The trolley would have undoubtedly mentioned it when the Center St. trolley was used in the Fourth of July parade. The stroke of midnight July 3 through to dawn. Part of the fun of the revelry was due to their foresight in running a rope from Center Church to a convenient tree nearby. The church bells pealed a good part of the night.

Equally rewarding were the sharp reports that could be heard every time a trolley ran up or down the street. The boys kept the tracks well tended with "terrapins."

Boatmen were not uncommon, but Curt Skiles, who the Clem Postillo, ran the Silk City Drive (another popular gathering place) reminded us this summer of a real high point in these annual celebrations.

Clem was conducting a breakfast stand in the diner. At one point in the gallery, someone threw a firecracker into the display and the result was spectacular. It was also noisy enough to wake the shell-shocked veterans of World War I, the hobbie-jobbies, to put it in the slang of the day. But to get back to the trolley.

Town Opens Garbage Bids On Tuesday

Bids for the collection of garbage will be opened in the general manager's office on Feb. 20 at 11 a.m. The contract is designed to provide collection of waste in town-owned equipment until June 30, 1962, and for collection of waste and rubbish, with the sale of equipment to the contractor, for a period from July 2, 1962, extending for one or two years. The contract also calls for twice a week collection of waste, and once a month collection of rubbish from the curb beginning July 2. The requirements for the four-month period beginning March 1 are collection of waste only, which the contract describes as "refuse which accumulates in the preparation of food for consumption in the home or public eating place including shells of shellfish, pieces of broken glass, paper or metal food containers and any decomposable matter... that can be contained in a container not to exceed 22 gallons." Waste does not include "materials from repair or construction of buildings of structures such as earth, plaster, mortar and roofing materials, septic tanks, trees or tree stumps over six inches in diameter, dangerous materials, infected materials and rubbish of a similar nature, junk yard wastes, solid industrial wastes and body wastes."

After the end of June, the contract requires collection of waste as in the four-month period preceding it, but adds once a month collection of rubbish, which consists of "plastic, metal and glass food containers, electric light bulbs, fluorescent light bulbs that are broken, waste paper, cans and bottles, wire, glass, heavy metal, automobile parts, broken kitchenware, mattresses, stuffed furniture, household appliances when dismantled, tree clippings, weeds, cardboard boxes, newspapers and brush." Brush must be tied in bundles, and no item may weigh more than 60 pounds. No article to be moved may be greater than three feet in length. Such materials as refrigerators, stoves, bed springs and other large heavy material will be picked up from the curb and not tied or wrapped. The contract requires the contractor to purchase six trucks from the town by July 2, 1962. Collections are to be made between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., unless permission is given by the general manager to collect during other times of the day. The contractor must submit a schedule of five routes, showing the streets from which he proposes to collect waste. The contract states, "For each reported failure to the town to collect waste in accordance with such schedule, the town may deduct \$2 from the next payment. A complaint shall be a failure to collect within a period of 24 hours after notification to the contractor."
