TV Personalities

Robert Goralski

Robert Goralski, recently named a Washington correspondent by NBC News, possesses an ability matched by Iew newsmen—he can speak be thesian.

Goralet learned the language, along with some Polish and Japanese, during his 14 years as a news reporter, which included work in Asia and the Pacific.

Born 54 years ago in Chicago, Goralski was graduated from the University of Illinois in 1949 with a B.S. in Journalism, While in college, he did work at student radio station WHL. in Urbana, Ill., leaving in 1951 as news director.

For the next four years, Goralski worked as a production adviser for Radio Free Asia and the Asia Foundation, both in San Francisco. In 1957, he moved to Washington, D.C., to work with the Voice of America and covered former Freshdent Elisenhower's trip to Asia in 1960, He left that organization in 1961 at which time he was chief of VOA's Burma desk.

When Goralski joined NBC News in Washington in August 1961, he worked on "Monitor," the "World News Roundup" and covered the chimpanese orbit at Cape Canaveral last fall.

In his spare time, most of which he spends writing, Goralski has produced one book, "Asia and larus," is currently working on a second, and has written several articles for the New Republic on French policy in Indo-China.

Goralski did graduate work at Johns Hopkins School for Advanced International Studies in Washington during 1960-51 while on a Ford Foundation fellowship.

As a Washington correspondent for NBC News, one of Goralski's assignments is covering President Kennedy on weekends.

Goralski lives in Fall Church, Va., with his wife, the former Margaret Anne Walton, of Wilton Junction, Iowa, and their two children, Douglas, 4, and Dorothy, 3.

And, finally, the medium solidifies into what we call program material—the routine stuff, the day-in-day-out commercial shows. There are always a few exceptions, but not many.

"TV has just about solidified now. The exceptions are fewer and fewer."
