State Board of Education Votes CD Education Plan

Connecticut is joining a federal program to use school teachers as Civil Defense instructors.

The State Board of Education authorized Connecticut's participation yeaterday by a vote of 4-3.

Known as the Civil Defense Adult Education Program, the plan calls for use of teachers to instruct families in CD procedures.

State Education Commissioner William J. Sanders in recommending Connecticut participation, said 18 other states have joined the plan. In New England, Maine intends to go into it. New Hampshire has turned it down and Massachuselts took no action because of opposition by the State Office of Civil Defense.

A state coordinator must be appointed and there must be federal approval of Connecticut's participation, Sanders said.

The state coordinator will attend a week-long course at the U.S. Office of Civil Defense in Battle Creek, Mich. Upon his return he will give 15 hours of instruction to the school teachers under the program and they will give 12-hour courses to the gen-
