Now read this pre-Easter greeting taxpayers: Before any department, commission, officer or employe of the town or the board of education shall make any purchase of or contract for any construction, supplies, materials, equipment or service, except personal services, involving an expenditure of more than one thousand dollars, opportunity shall be given for competitive bidding under such rules and regulations as the board of directors or the board of education, as the case may be, may establish. Either of said boards may waive the requirement for competitive bidding when in its opinion the circumstances of a particular case and the best interest of the town should permit its waiver and a majority of the board so state in writing. The library board is not specifically mentioned but read the opening line.

The town's C. P. A. warned long ago "In general we found records to indicate that competitive bids or quotations had been obtained for purchases of over \$1,000. A few purchases over \$1,000 were not put out to competitive bid. The Board should comply with Town Charter Section 5-22 which requires approval of the Board of Education to waive such bids."

Hackes, 37, began his broadcasting career as a news reporter for radio stations in Kentucky, Ohio Iowa and New York. He joined NBC News in Washington in 1965 after four years with CBS Washington. For the past four years Hackes has conducted NBC Radio's early-morning "World News Roundup." His news reports are also heard on NBC Radio's "News on the Hour." "Emphasis," "Monitor" and "News of the World." On TV he has been a a panelist on "Meet the Press" and "Ask Washington" and has reported on "Today."

Last summer, due to his familiarity with the nation's space program, Hackes was assigned to Cape Canaveral, Fls., as NBC Radio's anchorman to cover the flight of America's first astronaut and as NBC-TV anchorman for goverage of the second manned space flight.

And they showed mainly in art theaters, unfortunately. The large presentation houses wanted big stars in sensational, gripping, thrilling, hilarious dramas. They didn't want anything that was not box office.

Television is the medium best suited to documentaries, and we are building a great documentary tradition in American TV.

Over the years, these programs and others like them have contributed much to our knowledge of our present, to our understanding of our past, to our appreciation of our future. Some or these have been dull, a few slanted; happily only a small quantity have been really bad, By far the majority have been excitting unbiased, factual, and they are made for television, and television is made to them.
