If a recital of impleasant facts causes you to stick your head in the sand, ostrich-fashion, better skip this column. But if you are an intelligent teen-ager or a parent cr a teacher of teen-agers, you might devote a few minutes to the following shocking statistics:

There are, in the United States, approximately 1,200,000 as Heris. There are, in the United States, approximately 1.200,000 patients with syphilis in various stages, all in need of treatment.

Each year, approximately 1,000,000 fresh genorrheal infections are known to occur. Undoubtedly, many more are innerported.

The rate of infection is rising rapidly in middle and upper income brackets. And this rising incidence is more apparent in teenagers and, especially, girls. Incidentally, what is being reported in America is also being reported in England, continental Europe, Asia and in the U.S.S.R.

Nearly one out of every five

Nearly one out of every five cases of infectious syphilis (primary and secondary stages) occurs in patients younger than 19 years of age. In general, the infections occur at an earlier and years of age. In general, the infections occur at an earlier age in girls. And finally, to conclude this "chamber of horrors" for the moment, there were more girls infected with both gonorrhea and syphills at age 18 than at any other age.

What makes these revelations more shocking is the fact that we have in our possession simple and safe drugs that can both prevent and cure these venereal infections. Now I am not competent to discuss any but the medical aspects of this alarming problem. Nor can

of this alarming problem. Nor can I enter into a discussion of the problem as a whole. But I would like to make the following special suggestions to parents and teachers of teen-agers, and especially to those responsible for the health and welfare of 18-year-old girls whose incidence of infection is highest at the age of graduation from high school. By means of lectures with lar risks of promiscuous intercourse And include in this course of in struction the facts about illegit mate pregnancies whose incidence rates have been rising in the same

Warn these youngsters that much of the "red-hot dope" they tell one another about venereal prophylaxis and contraception is just not true. They cannot rely on prophylactic kits, douches and sulfa pills or bootlegged devices to keep them "out of trouble."

Emphasize to them that the risks they run far exceed the ficeting they run far exceed the fleeting pleasures they may obtain. Par-ticularly emphasize to girls that the road to the altar is not through promiscuity. Indeed, it is rather the contrary.

And stress the fact that the risks they run are at the expense of persons other than themselves. Members of the household. Their future spouses. Their children. And, in the case of infectious syphills, contacts other than those made during intercourse. For, if the infectious sore is in the mouth, the disease may be spread by kissing or by use of common eating and drinking utensils.

Harolan traced the history of educational television and discussed the effect that WEDH, Hartford's Channel 24, will have on Manchester when it begins broadcasting in the spring. The target date for Channel 24's opening is June 15, he said.

He said the Connecticut Educational Television Corp., a private enterprise which is establishing Channel 24, needs \$500,000 before it can go on the air. The state has provided \$200,000 of that figure, and private donations, such as the \$50,000 already received from the Travelers Insurance Co., are being
