Q — Just what is meant by "Charley horse"? Is it the same as bursitis? What can be done to relieve these conditions?

A—If you feel your calf muscle for example, you'll note that it has a soft bulge until it gets down to the back of the heel and there it narrows down to a tough thong—the Achilles tendon. If you were to look at the bulging portion, you'd see that it has all the characteristics of raw meat. It's red and composed of countless bands of muscle fibers. If you looked at the Achilles tendon, you'd see that it is glossy white and composed of tough fibers that resemble violinstrings.

Now in all likelihood, abuse misuse of a long muscle with tendonous insertion may result fraying or even tearing of a fe constituent fibers. The bulk of the fibers remain intact, but these fe fibers break and their torn enroll up to make tiny lumps. Relief is gott when the sore area is injected with a local anesthetic.
