I told you I was going to press a button somewhere to see what would happen. Any button. I rather imagine you'd do what you could to restrain me. Yet you have a three-pound elec-tronic computer just beneath your hat. It contains something be-tween 12 and 14 million cells, each acting as a sort of vacuum tube or transistor. Each of these is ca-pable of sending electric impulses of sufficient intensity to be meas-urable by detecting machines (electro-encephalograms). Engineers estimate that these cells operate on the equivalent of

Engineers estimate that these cells operate on the equivalent of less than 100 watts. They also tell us that a manmade machine that contained that many transistors would need 100 million watts. That is to say, all the power generated by Niagara Falls. And to cool the tubes in this manmade machine, you'd have to use all the water that descends from the Falls. We now have in our presention We now have in our possession drugs that influence our computer brains. They're called "mood drugs," Some of them calm and

drugs." Some of them caim and tranquilize. Others are pepper-up-pers. How they act and where they act to do what they do, no one of us knows at this moment. Yet, knowing no more about them than Td know if I stood in front of Univac, and having little more knowledge of what might happen than Td have if I pressed a button somewhere on Univac's panel board, millions of us are dosing ourselves with calmatives, tranguilizers, per-up pills to delay

tranquilizers, pep-up pills to delay fatigue and overcome sleepiness, and "brain stimulants." This is not to deny the useful-ness of these drugs in the treat-

ment of patients who have severe mental illnesses. But it is meant to call to your attention the folly of self-prescrib-ing or taking mood drugs of un-certain action any time you feel a bit tense, nervous, or down in the mouth. Or because you're intent on driving those extra few miles to ret whenever it is you work to set get wherever it is you want to get.
