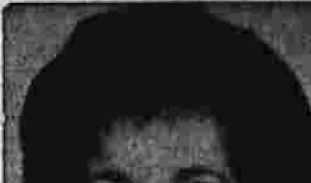

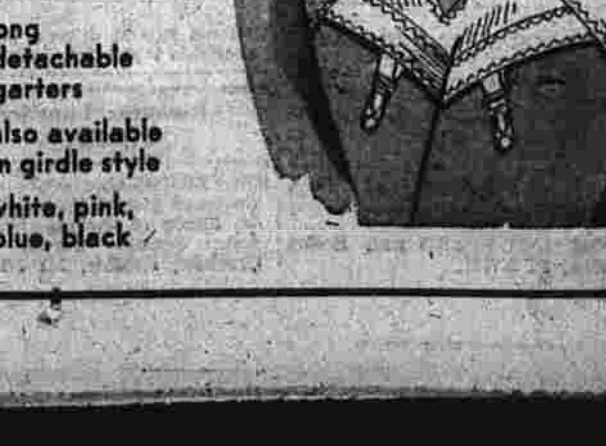

French Mass 60,000 Troops To Block OAS

ALGIERS (AP) — The French massed 60,000 troops in Algeria today to bring the city's 800,000 defiant European settlers under control.

Reinforcements rolled in from the countryside to guard against any new outbreak by the Secret Army organization fighting to subvert the cease-fire agreement between France and Algerian nationalist rebels.

The settlers' cause appeared hard hit by the heavy army fire into a crowd of Europeans Monday in which 45 Europeans were killed and 120 wounded in the heart of the city.

Argentina Confusion Spreading

By FRANK N. MANTIAS BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP) — President Arturo Frondizi calmly turned aside a new ultimatum from the military for his resignation today and dramatically ordered his pink palace cleared of battle-ready troops.

In a few minutes the battalion of troops armed with submachine guns, disappeared from positions in the palace and the palace and outside his office.

Published remarks went in discussing what would be sought in the Pacific test series as related to antimissile development. However, McNamara appeared to be referring to three tests in the anti-ICBM study: 1. The radar effect—A nuclear explosion, particularly one of high force, can produce an ionized cloud, this cloud can cut off the penetration of radar waves essential in tracking missiles and directing anti-missiles. This ionizing effect can extend as far as 100 miles and last up to several hours. Moreover, deliberate creation of ionized clouds perhaps could be used for decoy purposes to present false targets for the defending system.

2. Electro-magnetic effect. Some of the effects on guidance and other instruments might occur in the air, although the primary effect probably would be on the ground. An enemy missile exploding on the ground or up to several thousand feet above it could cripple cable and control systems temporarily, even though the blast and heat of the explosion left them physically undamaged. 3. The effect of one nuclear explosion on another. This seems to point to several possibilities. One is the idea that a neutron flux produced by nuclear explosion, ionizes and renders inoperative the warhead of an enemy missile. ### Hausner Demands Eichmann's Death

By GARVEN HUGHES  
JERUSALEM (AP)—Atty. Gen. Gideon Hausner concluded his case against Adolf Eichmann's appeal for clemency today with a plea to Israel's highest court to uphold the death sentence.

Hausner, winding up a 15-hour attack on Eichmann's arguments against the death penalty, declared: "He who chooses to follow the ways of Adolf Eichmann—murderer, traitor, assassin and murderer—must have as his end shame and his punishment death. There can be no justice here unless this is Eichmann's punishment."

"I ask that this court reject his appeal against his sentence," Hausner said. "Eichmann never finished as he listened to Hausner ask for his execution for the second time. A special tribunal last December sentenced the former Gestapo colonel to die."

Unless the supreme court grants a defense motion to put Eichmann on the stand again, the state of Israel has had its last say in court in the massive case it brought against him as the central figure in the Nazi extermination of six million European Jews.

Immediately after Hausner concluded his plea, the five justices adjourned until Thursday. Eichmann's counsel, Dr. Robert Serfati, will then make a final statement seeking commutation of the death sentence. The court also is likely to rule Thursday on defense motions to introduce new witnesses and to hear the accused again.

The court will probably take about a month to write its verdict on the appeal.

Hausner declared there was no need to summon new witnesses at this late date.

"We have submitted a host of documents here," Hausner said.

### Track Crossing To Be Widened By Green Manor

A proposal to triple the width of a driveway crossing the New Haven railroad track near Parker St. to property owned by Green Manor Construction Co., Inc., has struck European Jewry. It has drawn no objection from the Town Planning Commission.

The Doctor Says

Suppose we were being shown around the laboratory where they keep the... or some other of the electric computers. And suppose I told you I was going to press a button somewhere to see what would happen. Any button, rather than the one you would expect to see.

Let you have a three-pound electronic computer just behind your back. It contains something between 10 and 14 million cells, each acting as a sort of vacuum tube or transistor. Each of these is capable of sending electric impulses of sufficient intensity to be measurable by detecting machines (electro-mechanical).

Engineers estimate that these cells operate on the equivalent of less than 100 watts. They also tell us that a miniature machine, known as a "micro-miniature," would have to use all the water that descends from the Falls.

We now have in our possession drugs that influence our computer brains. They are called "psychedelics." Some of them calm and tranquilize others they pep-up. Some how they act and where they act to do what they do, no one of us knows at this moment.

Yet, knowing no more about them than I do know, I stand in front of Univac, and having little knowledge of what might happen then I have it pressed a button somewhere on Univac's control board, millions of us are doing ourselves with calmative, business, pep-up pills to delay fatigue and overcome sleepiness, and brain stimulants.

This is not to deny the usefulness of these drugs in the treatment of patients who have severe mental illnesses. But it is meant to call to your attention the folly of self-prescribing or taking mood drugs of uncertain action any time you feel a bit tense, nervous, or down in the mouth. Or because you're lousy on driving those extra few miles to get wherever it is you want to get.

"Experienced Homemakers, Inc." could also volunteer for civic committees and community projects — thereby giving their members some new and challenging interests and relieving young, busy housewives of such responsibilities. We put such a value on youth that we sometimes overlook our citizens who have the know-how that comes only with experience. With families as much on the move as they are today — young wives are often too far from their own relatives to turn to them for help when they are establishing their homes and families. If those who need a helping hand could turn to a group of experienced homemakers, then some of the knowledge acquired by experience could be passed on. It's an idea for women to think about.

Steering Committee Picked for Union Local

Despite two days of opposition voiced by the Manchester Education Association to the move, a minority teachers' group today speeded up action toward establishing a Manchester Local of the American Federation of Teachers, AFL-CIO.

The indefinite number of teachers which will staff the Manchester Teachers' Committee for the AFT last night elected a steering committee to handle an organizational drive.

The committee members, announced today, are William Dowd, Jay Slager, Andrew Vincosa and Robert Viter, off at Manchester High School; James Talbot of Bennett Junior High School and Neil Lawrence of Hill Junior High.

National and Connecticut Education Association officials yesterday afternoon backed up the MEA opposition to the proposed local, which MEA president Robert Wolf said is going to hurt every teacher in Manchester.

About 150 members of the Manchester Education Association met in the Manchester High School cafeteria to hear seven MEA and CEA officials challenge the details of the union. On Monday, representatives of the MEA presented their side of the question in a session which MEA president Robert Wolf presided over.

During yesterday's meeting, Robbing W. Barlow, J. of Westford, director of field service for the CEA, declined to accept an invitation to debate issues with a union official on the basis that a debate would lead to "personal antagonism and petty bickering."

Slager, who has been instrumental in forming the local, proposed the debate between Barlow and Neil Macy of Hartford, business manager for the AFT's Hartford chapter, as a means to resolve any questions. Slager said that he had been instructed by the MEA to refuse to accept the challenge.

Slager, who is chairman of the MEA's personnel policies committee and now a member of the local's steering committee, agreed with Slager, saying that a debate would be a contention of friendly forces in an open, free intellectual discussion. 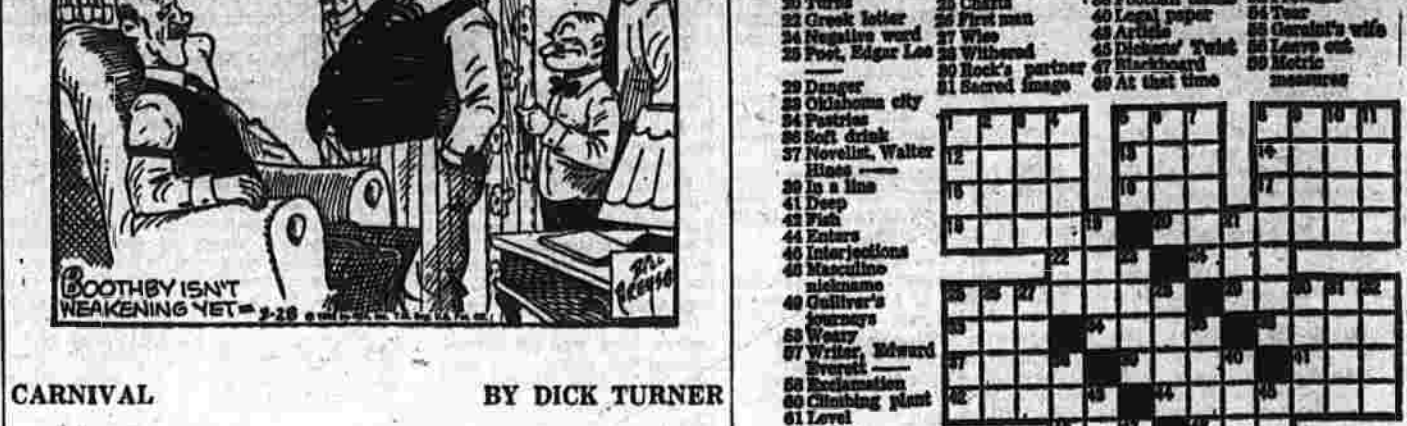
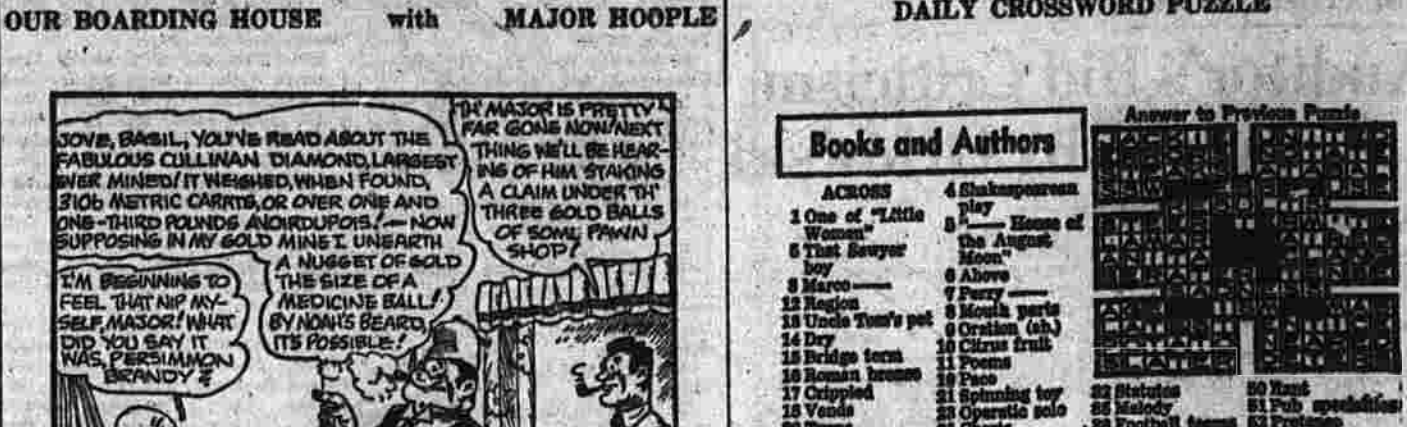
