Few people even today realize the great damage to community life and to individual health and comfort caused by uncontrolled mosquito breeding. And very few people become disturbed about mosquitoes until they start biting in May or June. Now, however, is the time to start thinking about the problem and to start planning to reduce their numbers. If 85% of them can be eliminated, the rest will hardly be noticed. But where should the killing begin?

Everyone should know that mosquitoes breed in water, not in grass or dry areas. Mosquito control experts know that killing the immature mosquito forms while they are still in the water is the most effective and economical method. If an attempt to kill mosquitoes is delayed until after they have hatched out and are on the wing, infesting extensive areas, they are produced wholesale and killed retail.

Mosquitoes that invade your house or disturb your backyard barbe-cue have probably bred in a stagnant pocket of water within a few hundred feet of your house, perhaps on your own land. Slaughter them wholesale at the breeding places! For example:

Stock ornamental pools with fish.

Eliminate standing water in cellars and under porches.

Drain clogged roof gutters and flat roofs.

Stack palls, barrels, tubs, vases, boats and wheelbarrows úpside

In residential woodland communities, where people have invaded the natural habitat of the mosquito and where mosquito annoyance is particularly severe, mosquitoes arise mainly from the temporary woodland pools and marshy areas. Most of these woodland pool and swamp mosquitoes are weak filers capable of traveling only short-distances, so it's likely that if breeding spots near your house are treated, numbers will be sharply cut. The best way of controlling these mosquitoes is to locate all the temporary woodland pools left by melting snow and spring rains and all marshy areas around thehouse during April and May, and treat them with 5% DDT. One treatment is usually sufficient, since many of these woodland pools dry up after June 1st. Any stagmant water areas that persist should be treated at monthly intervals during the summer months.

More costly and less efficient control steps have to be relied on once the insect takes flight in search of food. The adults of most species hide in grass and shrubs during the day to avoid the drying effect of the hot sun. This fact makes the application of insecticidal sprays to the surfaces of plants and other resting places a highly practical way of halting adult mosquitoes. Water emulsion or oil solution sprays of 5% DDT applied to these resting places at the rate of 2-5 gallons per acre and applied with a hand sprayer will control mosquitoes for about a week. The spray nozzle should be adjusted for a fine spray that almost floats in the air and drifts into the vegetation lightly. Heavier soaking doses waste material and may "burn" the plants.
