





As the new assistant dictitian at Manchester Memorial Hospital, Mrs. Robert Munson tells a certain group of patients each day what's good for them.

These patients have been assigned special diets, and it is part of Mrs. Munson's job to help them choose meals in keeping with those diets.

Every morning, she visits about 20 patients in the special care zone to help them plan their daily menus. At lunch time, she guides through the cafeteria line special diet patients from the First North self-care wing assisting them in

Mrs. Munson works with chief dielitian Mrs. Dorothy M. Dowding's "Dial Your Diet" wheel display, which outlines 12 special diets, and complies others herself. The menus she plans may range from bland foods for a patient with an aulcer to salf-free foods for a patient with high blood pressure.

Joined Staff in February Since joining the hospital staff Feb. 14, 24-year-old Mrs. Munson has also worked diversely as a teacher-counselee and writer, besides assistant dietary administrative, and the feels strongly that special diet patients must be taught that their particular food limitations are not for the hospital stay only, but for home as well. They must learn to choose between the right and wrong foods before they leave the hospital, she said.

"If they choose the right foods here, they're more apt to get the right foods at home," said Mrs. Munson.

She said she believes early education about nutrition would solve many of the questions people have about the values of crash or fad diets. School dietitians could also help teach youngsters the right foods to eat, she said.
