WASHINGTON (AP)-The administration's voter literacy test bill has been laid to rest for this session, talked to death by Southern senators. In its wake, civil rights advocates have promised another fight next session to change the Senate rules to make it easier to break fillbusters.

After twice refusing to choke off Southern speeches against the measure the Senate voted 49-24 late Tuesday to put the literacy bill aside and proceed to other legislation.

This wrapped up a victory for Southern foes of the measure. They had successfully staved off efforts to bring it to a vote ever since it was called up by Demo-cratic and Republican leaders on

Its supporters said the hill was almed at discrimination against Negroea by election registrars in about 100 Southern counties. Dixie senators denounced it as an unconstitutional infringement of states rights to determine other
